

THE PREPARED BREAKFAST FOODS AND GIVER CEREAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1957

A report on the prepared breakfast foods and other cereal products industry in Canada is herewith presented for the year 1937. Prior to 1930 producers of breakfast foods and other cereal products were included with the miscellaneous food industry. Statistics published in the present report refer only to firms whose principal products are breakfast foods and other cereal products. These products are also made in the flour milling industry which is covered by a separate report.

Production in this industry in 1937 included 68,115,156 pounds of prepared breakfast foods (corn flakes, bran flakes, wheat flakes, shredded wheat, muffets, force, etc.) valued at \$10,057,374, unprepared cereal products \$591,438 and all other products \$812,401. The total output of "prepared breakfast foods" in 1937 (including those produced in the flour milling industry), was 77,081,150 pounds valued at \$11,299,383 (see footnote to Table 2). Such "unprepared cereals" as oatmeal, rolled oats, etc., are produced almost exclusively in the flour milling industry and are not included in this report.

According to Table 1, firms whose principal products were prepared breakfast foods and other cereal products numbered thirty-four in 1937. Of these one was located in Cuebec, fifteen in Intario, four in Manitoba, three in Saskatchewan, six in Alberta and five in British Columbia. These firms reported a capital investment of \$5,161,165, they furnished employment to 764 persons who were paid \$896,188 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$4,377,758 for materials, and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$11,461,213. This industry is practically confined to the Province of Ontario, which produces almost 97 per cent of the industry.

Compared with the previous year there were increases of 6 in the number of establishments, \$694,580 in the value of production, \$734,983 in the cost of materials used, 62 in the number of employees, \$73,798 in the amount paid out in salaries and wages, and \$104,795 in capital investment.

Exports of cereal foods are considerable. In 1937 they amounted to \$4,289,526. Imports, however, are much smaller, amounting to only \$102,321 in 1937.

In the "Flour Milling Industry" in 1937 there were produced 8,965,994 pounds of "prepared breakfast foods" valued at \$1,242,009 and 12,293,912 pounds of "unprepared cereal products" valued at \$461,464. "Unprepared cereal products", such as rolled oats, oatmeal, cornmeal, etc., are produced almost exclusively in the "Flour Milling Industry", and are not included above. Stock and poultry foods are produced in the "Stock and Poultry Food Industry", and also in the "Flour Milling Industry". For the total production in Canada of the above products reference should be made to the alphabetical list of products published annually in the report "The Manufacturing Industries of Canada".
