### THE PREPARED BREAKFAST FOODS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1947

Prior to 1943 this industry included only firms whose principal products were prepared and unprepared breakfast foods. One flour mill whose principal products were flour and feed, and producing large quantities of these products, was, therefore excluded. This firm now makes two returns, one for the production of flour and feed which is included with the flour milling industry and another for their breakfast food production which is included with the breakfast food industry. We now have, therefore, all firms whose principal products are prepared breakfast foods classified in one industry, so that the figures given in the present report represent practically the total production in Canada of these products.

There were 19 establishments reporting in the breakfast foods industry in 1947, 9 were located in Onterio, 1 in Quebec, 3 in Manitoba, 1 in Saskatchewan, 1 in Alberta and 4 in British Columbia. These establishments furnished employment to 1,158 persons who were paid \$2,238,557 in salaries end wages. They also spent \$7,815,285 for materials, and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$15,242,203. This industry is practically confined to the province of Ontario which produces over 94 per cent of the total output.

Production in 1947 totalled 73,747,622 pounds of prepared breakfast foods (corn flakes, bran flakes, wheat flakes, puffed grains, shredded wheat, muffets, force, etc.) valued at \$11,822,475, unprepared breakfast foods 7,708,278 pounds valued at \$783,285 and other products to the value of \$2,636,443, making a total production for the industry amounting to \$15,242,203. Unprepared cereal products, such as outmeal, rolled outs, etc. which are mainly produced in the flour milling industry are not covered in this report.

Compared with the previous year there was a decrease in the physical volume of production, but an increase in the dollar value. The output of prepared breakfast foods decreased by 8,447,875 pounds or over 10 per cent, while unprepared breakfast cereals decreased by 2,182,844 pounds.

The tables following give detailed statistics of production, materials used, employment, etc.
