THE PREPARED BREAKFAST FOODS INDUSTRY

1951

Prior to 1943 this industry included only firms whose principal products were prepared and unprepared breakfast foods. One flour mill whose principal products were flour and feed, and producing large quantities of prepared breakfast foods, was, therefore excluded. This firm now makes two returns, one for the production of flour and feed which is included with the flour milling industry and another for their breakfast food production which is included with the prepared breakfast foods industry. We now have, therefore, all firms whose principal products are prepared breakfast foods classified in one industry, so that the figures given in the present report represent practically the total production in Canada of these products.

There were 20 establishments reporting in the prepared breakfast foods industry in 1951, 7 were located in Ontario, 4 in Quebec, 2 in Manitoba, 1 in Saskatchewan, 3 in Alberta and 3 in British Columbia. These establishments furnished employment to 1,254 persons who were paid \$3,586,673 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$11,179,392 for interials, and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$23,695,909. This industry is

practically confined to the province of Ontario which is responsible for nearly 90 per cent of the total value of production.

Production in 1951 totalled 74,681,345 pounds of prepared breakfast foods (corn flakes, bran flakes, wheat flakes, puffed grains, shredded wheat, muffets, force, etc.) valued at \$18,565,787, unprepared breakfast foods 9,082,312 pounds, valued at \$1,087,669 and other products to the value of \$4,042,453, making a total production for the industry amounting to \$23,695,909. Unprepared cereal products, such as oatmeal, rolled oats, etc. which are mainly produced in the flour milling industry are not covered in this report.

Compared with the previous year there was an increase in the physical volume of production, and also in the dollar value. The output of prepared breakfast foods increased by 6,922,979 pounds or over 12 per cent, while unprepared breakfast cereals decreased by 74,932 pounds.
