THE BREWING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1931.

The output of the Brewing Industry in 1931 was valued at \$49,055,739, which represents a decrease of \$8,465,350, or 14.7 per cent over that of the previous year. Beer, ale, stout and porter (full strength) were the main items of production with an output of 50,844,524 gallons valued at \$46,788,396. This compares with an output in 1930 of 57,362,326 gallons valued at \$55,134,901, a drop of 6,517,802 in the number of gallons and \$8,346,505 in the value. Other products manufactured were: - beer, ale, stout and porter (under full strength) \$1,177,072, aerated beverages \$721,131, wet and dry grains \$202,518, etc.

The number of establishments engaged in the production of malt liquors totalled eighty, located by provinces as follows: - Nova Scotia two, New Brunswick two, Quebec nine, Ontario thirty-four, Manitoba seven, Saskatchewan eleven, Alberta five and British Columbia ten. These plants represented a capital investment of \$63,140,211 in fixed and current assets, they furnished employment to 4,679 persons who were paid \$6,601,528 in salaries and wages, they also spent \$13,289,689 for materials and containers and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$49,055,739.

Compared with the previous year there was a decrease of \$4,496,931 in the amount of capital invested, although there was an increase of seven in the number of establishments. The decrease in capital is accounted for, mainly, by a decrease in the amount of cash, bills and accounts receivable, there being only minor decreases in the fixed capital and the inventory value of raw materials and finished products. The amount paid in salaries and wages was also \$155,106 lower in spite of an increase of thirty-seven in the number of employees, while the value of production was also \$8,465,350, or 14.7 per cent lower.

The tables following give detailed statistics of production, capital invested, materials used, employment, fuel, power, imports and exports.
