THE BREWING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1935.

The output of the brewing industry in 1935 was valued at \$40,699,040, which represents an increase of \$4,343,842 or almost 12 per cent as compared with the previous year. Beer, ale, stout and porter were the main items of production with an output of 54,656,923 gallons valued at \$40,070,826. This compares with an output of 46,390,221 gallons valued at \$35,501,069 in 1934. There was thus an increase of 8,266,702 in the number of gallons and \$4,569,757 in the value. Other products manufactured were aerated beverages \$302,338, wet and dry grains \$237,624, and yeast \$21,328.

The number of establishments engaged in the production of malt liquors totalled seventy three, located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia two, New Brunswick two, Quebec eight, Ontario thirty, Manitoba six, Saskatchewan nine, Alberta five and British Columbia eleven. These plants represent a capital investment of \$57,928,298 in fixed and current assets, they furnished employment to 4,460 persons who were paid \$6,155,642 in salaries and wages; they also spent \$15,024,625 for materials and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$40,699,040.

Compared with the previous year there were increases of 174 in the number of employees, \$563,253 in the amount paid in salaries and wages, \$3,411,913 in the cost of materials and \$4,343,842 in the value of production. /

With only eight of the seventy-three plants in Canada, the province of Quebec in 1935 produced 24,069,062 gallons, or over 44 per cent of the total output, employed almost 34 per cent of the number of employees and over 33 per cent of the capital engaged in the industry. These figures indicate that the plants in Quebec are comparatively larger than the plants situated in the other provinces.

The foreign trade in beer and ale is very small as compared with the domestic production. In 1935 imports amounted to 86,675 gallons valued at \$173,788 and exports 45,411 gallons valued at \$48,504. Compared with the previous year there was a decrease of \$26,532 in the value of the imports and a decrease of \$32,360 in the value of the exports.

The following tables give detailed statistics of production, capital invested, materials used, employment, fuel, power, imports and exports.

---

/ In spite of increased production, the capital invested in the industry declined by \$818,832 in 1935. Of this decrease, \$338,969 was in the fixed assets, due to current charges for depreciation; \$110,727 in the value of the inventories and \$369,136 in the amount of cash, accounts and bills receivable.

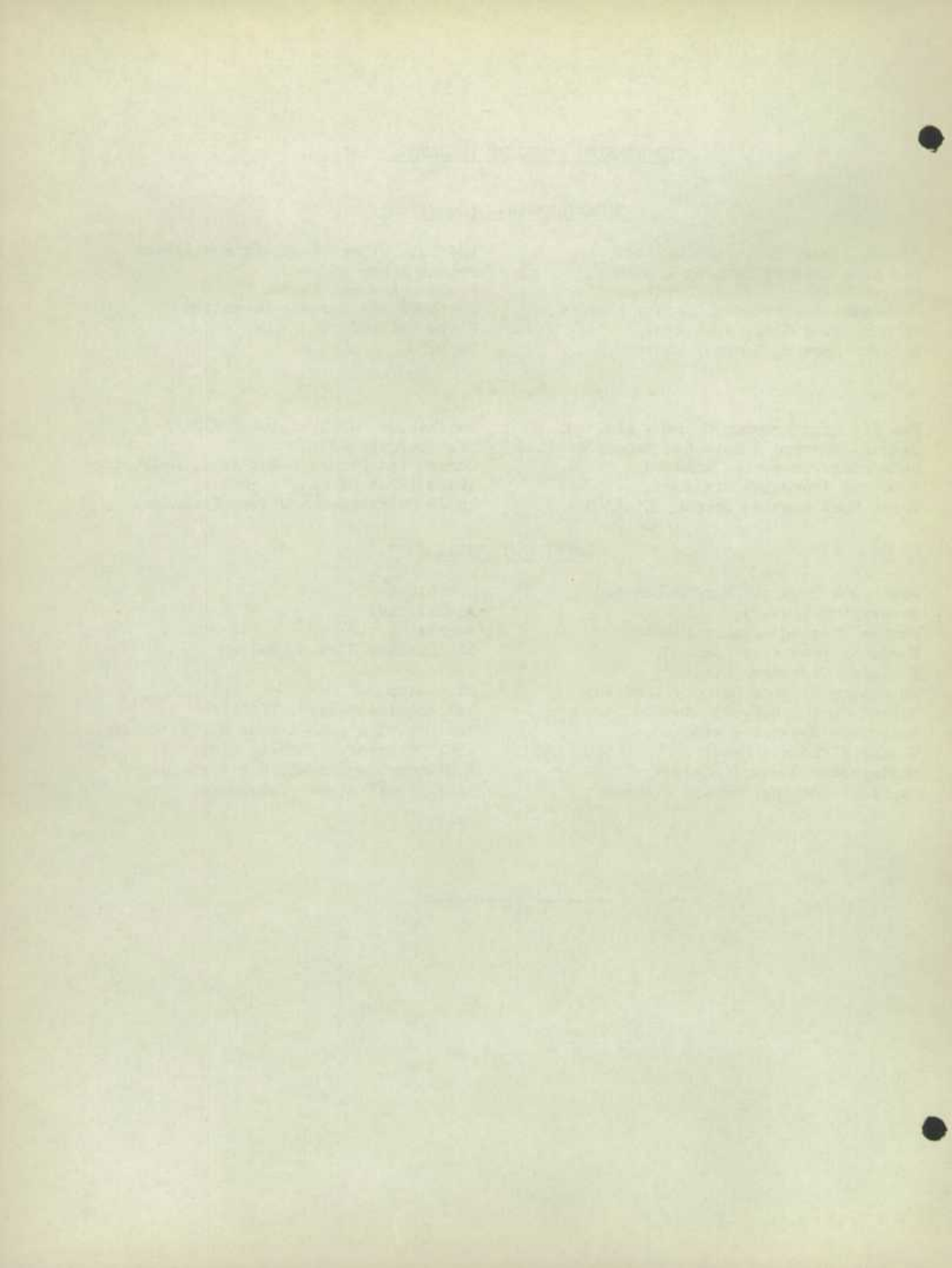
