THE BREWING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1936.

The output of the brewing industry in 1936 was valued at \$44,047,794, which represents an increase of \$3,348,754 or over 8 per cent as compared with the previous year. Beer, ale, stout and porter were the main items of production with an output of 56,916,859 gallons valued at \$43,344,707. This compares with an output of 54,656,923 gallons valued at \$40,070,826 in 1935. There was thus an increase of 2,259,936 in the number of gallons and \$3,273,881 in the value. Other products manufactured were aerated beverages \$392,554, wet and dry grains \$207,622 and yeast \$35,648.

The number of establishments engaged in the production of malt liquors totalled seventy, located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia two, New Brunswick two, Quebec eight, Ontario twenty-nine, Manitoba six, Saskatchewan seven, Alberta five and British Columbia eleven. These plants represent a capital investment of \$55,969,772 in fixed and current assets, they furnished employment to 4,604 persons, who were paid \$6,517,804 in salaries and wages, they spent \$15,540,509 for materials and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$44,047,794.

Compared with the previous year there were increases of 144 in the number of employees, \$362,162 in the amount paid in salaries and wages, \$515,884 in the cost of materials and \$3,348,754 in the value of production, but a decrease of \$1,958,526 in the capital investment.

With only eight of the seventy plants, the province of Quebec in 1936 produced 24,270,777 gallons, or almost 43 per cent of the total output, employed over 32 per cent of the number of employees and over 33 per cent of the capital engaged in the industry. These figures indicate that the plants in Quebec are comparatively larger than the plants situated in the other provinces.

The foreign trade in beer, ale, etc., is very small as compared with the domestic production. In 1936 imports amounted to 96,806 gallons valued at \$177,372 and exports 108,512 gallons valued at \$108,722. Compared with the previous year there was an increase of \$3,584 in the value of the imports and an increase of \$60,218 in the value of the exports.

The following tables give detailed statistics of production, capital invested, materials used, employment, fuel, power, imports and exports.
