

THE BREWING INDUSTRY OF CANADA, 1937

The output of the brewing industry in 1937 had a selling value at the factory of \$58,437,038. Sales tax and other taxes and duties paid to the Dominion and Provincial governments totalled \$14,951,967, leaving a net value of production of \$43,485,071. Due to the change in method in 1937 of reporting the selling value of products, comparisons with previous years cannot be made. Beer, ale, stout and porter were the main items of production with a total of 63,466,908 gallons valued at \$57,437,668. Other products manufactured were: aerated beverages \$532,616, wet and dry grains \$319,098, yeast \$37,252, etc. For detailed statistics of production, see tables 2 and 3.

The number of establishments engaged in the production of malt liquors totalled 65, located by provinces, as follows: Nova Scotia 2, New Brunswick 2, Quebec 8, Ontario 25, Manitoba 6, Saskatchewan 6, Alberta 5, and British Columbia 11. These plants represent a capital investment of \$64,162,671 in fixed and current assets, they furnished employment to 5,151 persons who were paid \$7,904,517 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$18,155,465 for materials and produced goods with a gross selling value at the factory of \$58,437,038 and a net selling value (gross less taxes) of \$43,485,071.

Compared with the previous year there were increases of \$8,192,899 in the capital invested, 547 in the number of persons employed, \$1,386,713 in the amount of salaries and wages paid and \$2,614,956 in the cost of materials used. The physical volume of production also increased substantially, the output of beer, ale, stout and porter having risen by 6,550,049 gallons or 11.5 per cent.

With only eight of the sixty-five plants, the province of Quebec in 1937 produced 27,472,726 gallons, or over 43 per cent of the total for Canada, employed over 38 per cent of the number of employees and over 45 per cent of the capital invested in the industry. This indicates that the plants in Quebec are comparatively larger than those situated in the other provinces.

The foreign trade in beer, ale, etc., is very small in comparison with the domestic production. In 1937 imports amounted to 107,774 gallons valued at \$162,844 and exports 156,000 gallons valued at \$161,554. Compared with the previous year there was a decrease of \$14,528 in the value of the former and an increase of \$52,832 in the value of the latter.

The following tables give detailed statistics of production, capital invested, materials used, employment, fuel, power, imports and exports.
