

### THE EREWING INDUSTRY OF CANADA, 1940.

The output of the brewing industry in 1940 had a selling value at the factory of \$75,210,969. Sales tax and other excise taxes and duties paid to the Dominion and Provincial governments totalled \$24,599,051, leaving a net value of production of \$50,611,918. Beer, ale, stout and porter were the main items of production with a total of 72,387,663 gallons valued at \$74,115,731 compared with 62,780,052 gallons valued at \$59,129,600 in 1939. Other products manufactured were: aerated beverages \$659,775, wet and dry grain \$285,286 and yeast \$40,397. For detailed statistics of production, see tables 2 and 3.

The number of establishments engaged in the production of malt liquors totalled 61, located by provinces, as follows: Nova Scotia 2, New Brunswick 2, Quebec 8, Ontario 22, Manitoba 6, Saskatchewan 5, Alberta 5, and British Columbia 11. These plants represent a capital investment of \$64,954,017 in fixed and current assets, they furnished employment to 5,520 persons who were paid \$9,004,800 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$24,876,452 for materials and produced goods with a gross selling value at the factory of \$75,210,969 and a net selling value (gross less taxes) of \$50,611,918.

Compared with the previous year there was an increase of \$6,978,576 in the net value of production, \$8,388,245 in the cost of materials used and \$3,308,140 in the capital invested. The physical volume of production was considerably higher, the output of beer, ale, stout and porter increasing by 9,607,611 gallons and \$14,986,131 in value. There was also an increase of 175 in the number of employees and an increase of \$553,398 in salaries and wages paid.

With only eight of the sixty-one plants, the province of Quebec in 1940 produced 28,974,922 gallons, or over 40 per cent of the total for Canada, employed over 36 per cent of the number of employees and over 39 per cent of the capital invested in the industry. This indicates that the plants in Quebec and comparatively larger than those situated in the other provinces.

The foreign trade in beer, ale, etc., is very small in comparison with the domestic production. In 1940 imports amounted to 96,921 gallons valued at \$136,177 and exports 240,666 gallons valued at \$218,773. Compared with the previous year there was an increase of \$12,675 in the value of the former and \$47,153 in the value of the latter.

The tables following give detailed statistics of production, capital invested, materials used, employment, fuel, power, imports and exports.
