THE BREWING INDUSTRY OF CANADA, 1942.

The output of the brewing industry in 1942 had a selling value at the factory of \$121,815,600. Sales tax and other excise taxes and duties paid to the Dominion and Provincial governments totalled \$47,790,999, leaving a net value of production of \$74,024,601. Beer, ale, stout and porter were the main items of production with a total of 109,017,630 gallons valued at \$120,211,668 compared with 90,247,237 gallons valued at \$96,420,962 in 1941. Other products manufactured were: aerated beverages \$803,751, wet and dried grain \$ 519,491 and yeast \$ 78,412. For detailed statistics of production, see tables 2 and 3.

The number of establishments engaged in the production of malt liquors totalled 61, located by provinces, as follows: Nova Scotia 2, New Brunswick 2, Quebec 8, Ontario 22, Manitoba 6, Saskatchewan 5, Alberta 5, and British Columbia 11. These plants represent a capital investment of \$72,668,623 in fixed and current assets, they furnished employment to 6,868 persons who were paid \$12,911,103 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$17,341,712 for materials and produced goods with a gross selling value at the factory of \$121,815,600 and a net selling value (gross less taxes) of \$74,024,601.

Compared with the previous year there was an increase of \$10,739,208 in the net value of production, and \$4,507,737 in the capital invested. The physical volume of production was considerably higher, the output of beer, ale, stout and porter increasing by 18,770,393 gallons and \$23,790,706 in value. There was also an increase of 936 in the number of employees and an increase of \$2,398,298 in salaries and wages paid.

With only eight of the sixty-one plants, the province of Quebec in 1942 produced 47,570,998 gallons, or over 43 per cent of the total for Canada, employed over 41 per cent of the number of employees and almost 41 per cent of the capital invested in the industry. This indicates that the plants in Quebec are comparatively larger than those situated in the other provinces.

The tables following give detailed statistics of production, capital invested, materials used, employment, fuel and power.

+ The decrease in the value of materials used is due to a change in the basis of reporting the value of malt and hops which are now given as the laid down cost at the factory, not including taxes and excise duties. By including these duties the value of materials used in 1942 would total about \$50,000,000.
