

THE BREWING INDUSTRY OF CANADA, 1946

The output of the brewing industry in 1946 had a selling value at the factory of \$184,068,403. Sales tax and other excise taxes and duties paid to the Dominion and Provincial governments totalled \$74,768,816, leaving a net value of production of \$109,299,587. Beer, ale, stout and porter were the main items of production with a total of 151,310,090 gallons valued at \$182,641,103 compared with 128,909,858 gallons valued at \$157,568,242 in 1945. Other products manufactured were: aerated beverages \$648,847, wet and dried grain \$572,126 and yeast \$119,856. For detailed statistics of production, see Tables 2 and 3.

The number of establishments engaged in the production of malt liquors totalled 61, located by provinces, as follows: Nova Scotia 2, New Brunswick 2, Quebec 8, Ontario 22, Manitoba 6, Saskatchewan 5, Alberta 5, and British Columbia 11. These plants furnished employment to 8,644 persons who were paid \$17,743,749 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$23,416,499 for materials and produced goods with a gross selling value at the factory of \$184,068,403 and a net selling value (gross less taxes) of \$109,299,587.

Compared with the previous year there was an increase of \$25,193,253 in the value of production. The physical volume of production also increased considerably, the output of beer, ale, stout and porter increasing by 22,400,232 gallons and the value by \$25,072,861. There were also increases of 1,051 in the number of employees and \$2,420,549 in salaries and wages paid.

Malt is the principal material used by the industry, the consumption in 1946 totalling 310,998,274 pounds valued at \$11,181,579. Hops, another important ingredient for the production of beer, totalled 4,377,774 pounds with a value of \$3,-747,506, while cartons, crowns, corks, labels, etc., used during the year had a value of \$6,300,973. In addition to the expenditure of \$23,416,499 for all consumable materials \$13,448,256 was spent for new and second hand bottles, barrels and kegs. For details of materials used see Table 4.

The tables following give detailed statistics of production, materials used, employment, fuel and power, and imports and exports.

The decrease in the value of materials used, since 1942, is due to a change in the basis of reporting the value of malt and hops which are now given as the laid down cost at the factory, not including taxes and excise duties. By including these duties the value of materials used would total \$50,586,633 in 1942, \$49,449,039 in 1943, \$58,326,555 in 1944, \$66,428,916 in 1945 and \$74,800,689 in 1946.

Note: Profits or losses cannot be estimated from Census figures as no data is collected for certain expense items, such as interest, rent, depreciation, taxes, insurance, advertising, etc.
