# THE BREWING INDUSTRY

1950

The output of the brewing industry in 1950 had a selling value at the factory of \$241,342,974. Sales tax and other excise taxes and duties paid to the Dominion and Provincial governments totalled \$91,933,487, leaving a net value of production of \$149,409,487. Beer, ale, stout and porter were the main items of production with a total of 171,055,633 gallons valued at \$238,703,555 compared with 173,294,151 gallons valued at \$228,333,919 in 1949. Other products manufactured were aerated beverages \$1,151,934, wet and dried grain \$985,543 and yeast \$99,662. For detailed statistics of production, see Tables 2 and 3.

The number of establishments engaged in the production of malt liquors totalled 63, located by provinces, as follows: Newfoundland 3, Nova Scotia 2, New Brunswick 2, Quebec 8, Ontario 21, Manitoba 6, Saskatchewan 5, Alberta 5, and British Columbia 11. These plants furnished employment to 8,311 persons who were paid \$23,888,605 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$42,018,271 for materials and produced goods with a gross selling value at the factory of \$241,342,974 and a net selling value (gross less taxes) of \$149,409,487.

Compared with the previous year there was an increase of \$7,009,758 in the value of production. The physical volume of production was, however, lower. The output of beer, ale, stout and porter decreased by 2,238,518 gallons but the selling value increased by \$10,369,636. Although the number of employees decreased by 341, the amount paid in salaries and wages was \$427,168 more than the amount paid in 1949.

Malt is the principal material used by the industry, the consumption in 1950 totalling 349,250,100 pounds valued at \$22,196,124. Hops, another important ingredient for the production of beer, totalled 4,415,205 pounds with a value of \$3,465,179, while cartons, cans, crowns, corks, labels, etc., used during the year had a value of \$13,270,346. In addition to the expenditure of \$42,018,271 for all consumable materials, \$3,979,201 was also spent for new bottles, cases, barrels and kegs. For details of materials used see Table 6.

The tables following give detailed statistics of production, materials used, employment, fuel and power, and imports and exports.
