### THE BREWING INDUSTRY

### 1951

The output of the brewing industry in 1951 had a selling value at the factory of \$274,418,064. Sales tax and other excise taxes and duties paid to the Dominion and Provincial governments totalled \$113,259,031, leaving a net value of production of \$161,159,033. Beer, ale, stout and porter were the main items of production with a total of 177,657,694 gallons valued at \$271,555,265 compared with 171,055,633 gallons valued at \$238,703,555 in 1950. Other products manufactured were aerated beverages \$1,160,175, wet and dried grain \$1,119,499 and yeast \$159,581. For detailed statistics of production, see Tables 2 and 3.

The number of establishments engaged in the production of malt liquors totalled 63, located by provinces, as follows: Newfoundland 3, Nova Scotia 2, New Brunswick 2, Quebec 8, Ontario 21, Manitoba 6, Saskatchewan 5, Alberta 5, and British Columbia 11. These plants furnished employment to 8,449 persons who were paid \$27,489,309 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$45,905,901 for materials and produced goods with a gross selling value at the factory of \$274,418,064 and a net selling value (gross less taxes) of \$161,159,033.

Compared with the previous year there was an increase of \$33,075,090 in the value of production. The physical volume of production also increased. The output of beer, ale, stout and porter increased by 6,602,061 gallons and the selling value increased by \$32,851,710. The number of employees increased by 138, and the amount paid in salaries and wages was \$3,600,704 more than the amount paid in 1950.

Malt is the principal material used by the industry, the consumption in 1951 totalling 363,523,330 pounds valued at \$24,487,896. Hops, another important ingredient for the production of beer, totalled 4,302,615 pounds with a value of \$3,540,581, while cartons, cans, crowns, corks, labels, etc., used during the year had a value of \$15,030,592. In addition to the expenditure of \$45,905,901 for all consumable materials, \$6,116,157 was also spent for new and secondhand bottles, cases, barrels and kegs.
