# THE BREWING INDUSTRY

# 1952

The output of the brewing industry in 1952 had a selling value at the factory of \$303,929,962. Sales tax and other excise taxes and duties paid to the Dominion and Provincial governments totalled \$125,161,156, leaving a net value of production of \$178,768,806. Beer, ale, stout and porter were the main items of production with a total of 193,830,348 gallons valued at \$300,475,178 compared with 177,657,694 gallons valued at \$271,555,265 in 1951. Other products manufactured were aerated beverages \$1,511,302, wet and dried grain \$1,221,959 and yeast \$131,755. For detailed statistics of production, see Tables 2 and 3.

The number of establishments engaged in the production of malt liquors totalled 61, located by provinces, as follows: Newfoundland 3, Nova Scotia 2, New Brunswick 2, Quebec 6, Ontario 21, Manitoba 6, Saskatchewan 5, Alberta 5, and British Columbia 11. These plants furnished employment to 8,163 persons who were paid \$30,143,552 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$49,713,488 for materials and produced goods with a gross selling value at the factory of \$303,929,962 and a net selling value (gross less taxes) of \$178,768,806.

Compared with the previous year there was an increase of \$29,511,898 in the gross selling value of production and \$17,609,773 in the net selling value. The physical volume of production also increased. The output of beer, ale, stout and porter increased by 16,172,654 gallons and the selling value increased by \$28,919,913. The number of employees decreased by 286 and the amount paid in salaries and wages was \$2,654,243 more than the amount paid in 1951.

Malt is the principal material used by the industry, the consumption in 1952 totalling 393,125.325 pounds valued at \$24,701,912. Hops, another important ingredient for the production of beer, totalled 4,229,038 pounds with a value of \$3,623,261, while cartons, cans, crowns, corks, labels, etc., used during the year had a value of \$18,247,373. In addition to the expenditure of \$49,713,488 for all consumable materials, \$5,665,785 was also spent for new bottles, cases, barrels and kegs. For details of materials used see Table 6.

The tables following give detailed statistics of production, materials used, employment, fuel, imports and exports.
