THE BREWING INDUSTRY

1954

The output of the brewing industry in 1954 had a selling value of factory shipments amounting to \$321,467,470. Sales tax and other excise taxes and duties paid to the Dominion and Provincial governments totalled \$123,077,301, leaving a selling value less taxes of \$198,390,169. Beer, ale, stout and porter were the main items of production with a total of 200,459,309 gallons valued at \$317,725,745 compared with 206,908,214 gallons valued at \$324,203,939 in 1953. Other products manufactured were aerated beverages \$1,519,192, wet and dried grain \$1,367,738 and yeast \$157,874. For detailed statistics of shipments, see Tables 2 and 3.

The number of establishments engaged in the production of malt liquors totalled 62, located by provinces, as follows: Newfoundland 3, Nova Scotia 2, New Brunswick 2, Quebec 6, Ontario 21, Manitoba 6, Saskatchewan 5, Alberta 6, and British Columbia 11. These plants furnished employment to 8,541 who were paid \$33,422,844 in salaries and wages. They spent \$47,590,063 for materials and the value of factory shipments amounted to \$321,467,470. The selling value, less taxes, amounted to \$198,390,169.

Compared with the previous year there was a decrease of \$6,514,108 in the gross selling value of products and \$2,495,487 in the net selling value. The physical volume of production also decreased. The output of beer, ale, stout and porter decreased by \$6,448,905 gallons and the selling value decreased by \$6,478.194. The number of employees increased by 158 and the amount paid in salaries and wages was \$1,684,947 more than the amount paid in 1953.

Malt is the principal material used by the industry, the consumption in 1954 totalling 368,918,143 pounds valued at \$20,621,662. Hops, another important ingredient for the production of beer, totalled 3,964,223 pounds with a value of \$3,035,786, while cartons, cans, crowns, corks, labels, etc., used during the year had a value of \$18,248,571. In addition to the expenditure of \$47,590,063 for all consumable materials, \$4,595,845 was also spent for new bottles, cases, barrels and kegs. For details of materials used see Table 6.

Beginning in 1954, statistics were collected on opening and closing inventory values at each plant. A compilation of this information is shown in Table 5.

In Table 1, showing orincipal statistics of the industry, a column has been added headed "value added by manufacture". These figures are obtained by subtracting the cost of materials used, including fuel and electricity, from the value of production. In 1954, the value of production was obtained by adding the difference between closing and opening inventory values of finished goods to the value of factory shipments.

The tables following give detailed statistics of products, inventories, materials used, employment, imports and exports.
