THE BREWING INDUSTRY

1955

The brewing industry in 1955 had a selling value of factory shipments amounting to \$334,868,143. Sales tax and other excise taxes and duties paid to the Dominion and Provincial governments totalled \$124,296,290, leaving a selling value less taxes of \$210,571,853. Beer, ale, stout and porter were the main items of production with a total of 211,101,903 gallons valued at \$331,117,100 compared with 200,459,309 gallons valued at \$317,725,745 in 1954. Other products manufactured were aerated beverages \$1,568,799, wet and dried grain \$1,315,179 and yeast \$161,682. For detailed statistics of shipments, see Tables 2 and 3.

The number of establishments engaged in the production of malt liquors totalled 58, located by provinces, as follows: Newfoundland 3, Nova Scotia 2, New Brunswick 2, Quebec 4, Ontario 21, Manitoba 6, Saskatchewan 5, Alberta 6, and British Columbia 9. These plants furnished employment to 8,368 persons who were paid \$34,387,685 in salaries and wages. They spent \$48,677,904 for materials and the value of factory shipments, less taxes and duties, amounted to \$210,571,853.

Compared with the previous year there was an increase of \$12,181,684 in the selling value of factory shipments. The output of beer, ale, stout and porter increased by 10,642,594 gallons and the selling value increased by \$13,391,355. The number of employees decreased by 173 but the amount paid in salaries and wages was \$964,841 more than the amount paid in 1954.

Malt is the principal material used by the industry, the consumption in 1955 total-ling 381,776,285 pounds valued at \$20,790,545. Hops, another important ingredient for the production of beer, totalled 3,819,946 pounds with a value of \$2,650,626, while cartons, cans, crowns, corks, labels, etc., used during the year had a value of \$20,190,568. In addition to the expenditure of \$48,677,904 for all consumable materials, \$5,910,696 was also spent for new bottles, cases, barrels and kegs. For details of materials used see Table 6.

Beginning in 1954, statistics were collected on opening and closing inventory values at each plant. A compilation of this information is shown in Table 5.

In Table 1, showing principal statistics of the industry, a column has been added headed "value added by manufacture". These figures are obtained by subtracting the cost of materials used, including fuel and electricity, from the value of production. Since 1954, the value of production was obtained by adding the difference between closing and opening inventory values of finished goods to the value of factory shipments.

The tables following give detailed statistics of products, inventories, materials used, employment, imports and exports.
