LIQUORS DISTILLED IN CANADA, 1922

Ottawa, July, 1924.— The Dominion Bureau of Statistics presents herewith a report on the distillation of liquors in Canada during the calendar year 1922. There were six establishments reported operations during that year, three of which were in the province of Ontario, and three in Quebec.

PRINCIPAL STATISTICS

The principal statistics of the industry are given for Canada and the provinces in Table I.

PRODUCTION

The quantity and value of the principal products of the industry will be found in Table II by provinces for the calendar year 1922. Of the net value of production, Ontario contributed \$2,267,639 or 68.7 per cent and Quebec provided \$1,028,906 or 31.3 per cent. In both provinces potable spirits were the most important item of production and together were equivalent to 70.8 per cent of the total of all products for the Dominion.

CAPITAL INVESTMENT

The capital employed in the industry is shown by provinces in Table III for the calendar year 1922. Out of a total capitalization of \$15,253,827, fixed capital comprising the value of land, buildings, fixtures, machinery and tools amounted to \$5,982,211 or 39 per cent of the total investment, whilst working capital which includes the value of materials on hand, stocks in process, cash, trading and operating accounts, etc., was reported at \$9,271,616 or 61 per cent.

EMPLOYEES, SALARIES AND WAGES

The total number of employees engaged in the industry is given in Table IV for the year 1922, by (a) classes of employment, (b) sex and (c) salary and wage payments. The combined salary list and wage earners' pay roll amounted to \$466,587, to which Ontario contributed \$375,052, being 80.3 per cent of the total.

OTHER EMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

The number of persons of each sex on the pay roll each month, by provinces for the calendar year 1922, will be found in Table V. February shows the largest number of male employees on the pay roll with 296, whilst the minimum was reached in October when only 162 were employed. The female wage earners were at their maximum in June with 12, but for January, and from July to December inclusive, only 7 women were required.

FUEL CONSUMPTION

Only one kind of fuel was used in the industry during 1922, and that was bituminous coal, of which a total of 29,789 tons were consumed at a cost of \$240,929. Of this amount, Ontario accounted for 26,121 tons valued at \$206,302, and Quebec required 3,668 tons with an expenditure of \$34,627.

POWER INSTALLATION

The power employed in the industry is shown in Table VII by classes of power, the number of units in each class and the indicated horse-power capacity according to manufacturer's rating.

MATERIALS USED

The quantity and value of the various materials used in the industry are given in Table VIII by provinces for the calendar year 1922. The principal material used was molasses, of which 3,161,476 gallons were consumed at a cost of \$527,120. Next in importance was corn with a total consumption of 572,604 bushels valued at \$429,467. The total expenditure for all materials for the Dominion was \$1,546,376, of which Ontario contributed \$977,134 or 63.2 per cent and Quebec \$569,242 or 36.8 per cent.

MISCELLANEOUS EXPENSES

The total overhead charges or miscellaneous expenses incurred in the industry during 1922 amounted to \$556,041. Of this amount \$412,633 was chargeable to the Province of Ontario, whilst the remaining \$143,408 was expended by the Province of Quebec. The principal items comprising miscellaneous expenses are, rent of buildings, taxes, insurance premiums, power rentals, advertising and travelling expenses and repairs to buildings and machinery. Owing to changes made in the general schedule for 1922, manufacturers are no longer required to itemize their miscellaneous expenses.

IMPORTS AND EXPORTS

The quantity and value of all distilled beverages and industrial alcohol imported into and exported from Canada during the calendar year 1922 will be found in Table IX. The total quantity of distilled beverages imported into Canada during the year above mentioned was 1,222,596 gallons valued at \$20,269,501, whilst the exports for the same period amounted to 314,438 gallons valued at \$2,752,508. Industrial alcohol imported totalled 23,788 gallons of the value of \$91,891, whilst the exports were 115,151 gallons valued at \$93,884.
