

THE DISTILLED LIQUOR INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1934.

In 1934 there were seventeen establishments engaged in the production of distilled liquor, — six in Quebec, nine in Ontario and two in British Columbia. Three of these did bottling only. These seventeen establishments in 1934 reported a capital investment of \$47,980,630, a payroll of 1,643 persons who received \$1,812,945 in salaries and wages, and had a net value of production of \$12,230,113.

This industry performs three distinct operations, viz., (1) distillation of liquors which are stored away for at least two years for maturing and which are, therefore, not sold during the current year, (2) distillation of non-potable alcohol which may be sold during the year that it is produced, and (3) bottling of matured liquors which have been produced in previous years. Several changes have, therefore, been made in the schedule since 1931 in order to show each of these operations more clearly as well as to show the value of new products made by the industry each year.

Whiskies and other potable spirits produced during the year and put in bond for maturing totalled 2,912,522 proof gallons with an inventory value of \$1,106,677, while whiskies and other potable spirits bottled or shipped in bulk totalled 3,413,948 proof gallons valued at \$12,506,201. Other important products were: denatured alcohol 2,282,924 proof gallons valued at \$915,731 and non-potable alcohol 1,518,928 proof gallons valued at \$625,965. In order to avoid duplication, however, the prime cost of spirits produced in previous years and bottled or shipped in bulk during 1934 must be deducted from the value of production in order to arrive at the value of new products made by the industry in 1934. Detailed statistics of production are given in table 2.

Imports of distilled liquors in 1934 totalled 748,847 proof gallons with a value of \$13,755,512. This is an increase of 71,980 proof gallons over 1933. Exports were valued at \$19,858,594, an increase of \$10,800,343 as compared with 1933. Distilled liquors re-exported in 1934 were valued at \$22,047.

Detailed statistics of production, materials used, imports and exports, capital investment, employment, etc., are given in the tables following.

Size of Establishments

A series of tables is presented showing in a threefold way the size of establishments in the distilled liquor industry, measured by (a) capital investment, (b) value

of production and (c) employment. The tables, compared for a number of years, indicate the movement of capital, production and employment within the industry.

In 1934 the establishments reporting numbered seventeen with a total capital investment of \$47,980,630, a total value of production of \$12,230,113 and a total employment of 1,643 persons. Of the total number of establishments, three had a combined capital investment of \$28,127,953 or over 58 per cent of the total invested in the industry and an average investment per establishment of \$9,375,984. In value of production five establishments had a combined output of \$9,283,245 or over 75 per cent of the total for the industry and an average output per establishment of \$1,856,649. Of the total number of employees, five establishments had a combined payroll of 1,289 persons or over 78 per cent of the total and an average employment per establishment of 258.
