## THE WINE INDUSTRY, 1919.

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics has completed a preliminary survey of the above industry for the calendar year 1919, covering the operations of 16 individual plants, 12 of which are located in the Province of Ontario, 3 in the Province of Quebec, and 1 in the Province of British Columbia. The figures for the latter province are combined with those of Quebec in all the tables to prevent the disclosure of an individual establishment.
