## THE WINE INDUSTRY, 1920.

Ottawa, January, 1922:- The Dominion Bureau of Statistios has completed a preliminary report on the Wine Industry in Canada for the calendar year 1920, oovering the operations of 13 individual plants, ten of which were located in Ontario, two in Quobeo and one in British Columbia.
