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

P R E F A C E

Annual statistics of dairy factories of Canada are issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in collaboration with the Provincial Departments concerned. The arrangements for co-operation embrace all the provinces but the procedure varies in respect to the collection of returns. For all provinces a uniform schedule is printed by the Dominion Bureau; for Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia the schedules are distributed and the returns collected and revised by the provincial commissioners, the returns being then forwarded to the Bureau for compilation, and the resulting statistics used as desired by both the Dominion and Provincial Departments. In the case of Nova Scotia, Ontario and Manitoba the schedules are distributed and the returns collected, revised and compiled by the Dominion Bureau, the provincial Department of Agriculture furnishing the lists of dairy factories. The Quebec Bureau of Statistics collects and compiles the returns and forwards to the Dominion Bureau the results of the compilations; the original reports of the dairy factories are also placed at the disposal of the Dominion Bureau.

These arrangements ensure uniformity of the dairy statistics issued by the Dominion and Provincial Governments, and avoid the necessity for duplicate inquiries to factory operators.

The Dairy Products Division of the Dominion Department of Agriculture also co-operates, its officers furnishing advice in technical details.

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THE DAIRYING INDUSTRY OF CANADA

Dairying is one of the oldest and one of the most important Canadian industries. The factory system was introduced in 1864 when the first Canadian cheese factory was established in Ontario, and the first Canadian creamery for butter-making in Quebec in 1873. The first centrifugal cream separator was imported from Denmark in 1882, and the Government organization of cold storage services dates from 1895. In 1868, the quantity of cheese exported from Canada was 6,141,570 pounds and of butter 10,649,733 pounds. There was a rapid advance in the export trade of cheese after that date, and a moderate advance in the export of butter. Cheese reached its maximum export in 1904 with 233,980,716 pounds, and butter in 1903 with 34,128,944 pounds.

The decline shown in the exports of cheese and butter in the succeeding years is due to the greater requirements of home consumption caused by the relative increase of urban population since the beginning of the present century.¹ This has had the effect of increasing the demand for milk consumed whole and of replacing the manufacture of cheese for export by that of butter sold for home consumption. There has also been a large increase in the production of concentrated milk, i.e., condensed and evaporated milk, milk powder, etc. The first plant was established at Truro, N.S., in 1883, and there are now in Canada thirty-one plants for the manufacture of concentrated milk.

Government Assistance. - The Federal Government through the Department of Agriculture and the Department of Trade and Commerce assists in various ways in promoting the interests of the dairy industry. The Dairy Products Division has charge of this work for the Dominion Department of Agriculture. Its principal activities, which are designed primarily to assist the farmer, include the following.

Market Intelligence Service. - A weekly Market Report is issued giving a review of dairy market conditions on the Montreal, Toronto and New York markets; records of transactions on Country Boards in Ontario and Quebec are also included in the report; prepaid market telegrams are sent to the different provincial dairy officials so that the information may be distributed by them throughout the different provinces; in addition, collect market telegrams are sent to any one desiring to receive them; a monthly Dairy News Letter and a monthly Cold Storage News Letter, as well as bulletins from time to time, are published.

Grading. - All creamery butter and factory cheese exported from Canada must be graded before being exported and graders are maintained at various centres throughout the Dominion. The grading of butter for domestic consumption may be compulsory by the proclamation of Regulation No. 28, under the Dairy Industry Act, in any province, and the passing of legislation by the province authorizing the Dominion Government to enforce the Regulation. The Regulation became operative in the provinces of British Columbia and Alberta on the 1st of May, 1935; in Saskatchewan and Manitoba on the 1st of June, 1935; in Ontario on the 1st of September, 1936 and in Quebec and New Brunswick on the 1st of June, 1937.

Iced Car Services. - (a) Arrangements are made for the operation of iced refrigerator car services over specified routes to Toronto, Montreal, Quebec and Halifax, for butter and eggs, during the months of June, July, August and September, and inspection is made of the cars on arrival at destination. (b) Arrangements are also made with the different railway companies to operate iced refrigerator cars for the transportation of cheese to Montreal, Quebec and Halifax for export.

Cargo Inspection. - Cargo inspectors are maintained at the Canadian ports of Montreal, Quebec, Vancouver and Halifax and during the winter months at the port of Saint John, N.B.; inspection service is also maintained at London, Southampton, Liverpool, Manchester and Glasgow in the United Kingdom.

Supervision of Concentrated Milk Plants. - Officials visit regularly all plants manufacturing condensed, evaporated and dried milk, and render assistance to the different establishments in the way of expert technical advice; inspection also is made of the manufactured products in order to see that the standards of composition and of net weights are complied with.

Research. - Defects in the quality of dairy products are studied and remedies suggested.

Milk Utilization Service. - A staff of trained dieticians is employed to give demonstrations and lectures on the value of milk and its products in the diet.

Cold Storage Warehouse Subsidies. - Under the provisions of the Cold Storage Act the government may enter into contracts with persons or firms for the payment of subsidies on the construction of public cold storage warehouses.

Subsidies paid to primary producers of milk and butterfat. - Government subsidies have been used as an incentive to maintain or increase production of essential dairy products during the war and period of reconversion. These subsidies have been paid under the direction of the Agricultural Food Board. Throughout 1946 a subsidy of 10 cents per pound was paid to producers for butterfat used in the manufacture of creamery butter. A subsidy of 20 cents per 100 pounds for milk used in the manufacture of Cheddar cheese was paid from January 1, 1946 to April 30. From May 1 to the end of the year the rate was 30 cents. Producers of milk for concentration purposes were also paid a subsidy at the following rates: January 1 to April 30, 30 cents per 100 pounds; May 1 to September 30, 23 cents per 100 pounds. Manufacturers acted as agents of the Government for the payment of these subsidies. The subsidy was removed effective October 1, 1946.

¹ In the year 1940, due to the demand created by the War, there was an upturn in the export of dairy products, and the higher level was maintained in 1943. The items chiefly responsible for the advance are cheese, and condensed and evaporated milk.

Stabilization Programme. - In order to control the utilization of milk the Agricultural Food Board instituted a stabilization programme in October 1st, 1943. While this program was in effect, it was necessary for manufacturers and distributors to obtain permission from the Board before purchasing milk or cream from other than those from whom they were purchasing milk or cream prior to and regularly since September 30, 1943. This control was discontinued at October 31, 1945.

The Department of Agriculture paid a premium in 1947, of one cent per pound on all cheddar cheese produced in the Dominion scoring 93 points, and two cents per pound on cheese scoring 94 points or over. The Department of Agriculture has also undertaken during the past few years to encourage the amalgamation of small cheese factories into larger units, by paying a subsidy of 50 per cent of the cost, where two or more cheese factories amalgamate.

The price of cheese shipped to the British Ministry of Food under the 1947-48 agreement and which was on a basis of 25 cents per pounds, First Grade, f.o.b. Factory Shipping point, was not supplemented by the Canadian Government apart from the regular premium which was paid and which is referred to in the preceding paragraph of the report. The province of Ontario continued to pay subsidies on cheese during the year 1947, but only during the period of requisitioning of cheese for the Ministry of food. The province of Quebec discontinued the payment of subsidy on first grade cheddar cheese on December 1, 1942, and it was not until July 1, 1943, that it was again introduced and carried on for the remainder of the calendar year. Quebec discontinued on November 1, 1944.

The Dairy Products Board supported the creamery butter market during the calendar year 1947 by buying butter at the minimum prices which were established. (a)

The Department of Trade and Commerce renders assistance chiefly in matters connected with the marketing abroad of cheese and butter, the control of imports of dairy products, and the publication of statistics.

Information regarding the production of milk on Canadian farms was collected for the first time in the Census of 1911 (covering production in the year 1910), but an estimate had been made for 1900 which placed production in that year at 6,866,834,000 pounds. In 1910 (census) the production of milk amounted to 9,806,-741,348 pounds, in 1920 (census) to 10,976,235,351 pounds, in 1930 (census) to 12,854,323,094 pounds, and in 1940 (census) 15,648,785,757 pounds, an increase since the beginning of the century of 128 per cent. The production of milk in Canada in 1947 is estimated at 17,240,788,000 pounds. (b)

The statistics in this report relate solely to the production of dairy factories; they do not include butter made on the farm and known as "dairy butter" and farm-made cheese. The Census of 1941 showed that the production of dairy butter in 1940 was 81,701,486 pounds, and of home-made cheese 808,034 pounds, these quantities representing, respectively, 24 and 0.6 per cent of the totals. An estimate made by the Agricultural Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics places the production of dairy butter in 1947 at 56,295,000 pounds and of farm-made cheese at 740,000 pounds.

Complete statistics of the production of dairy factories date from 1900, when the total value of the products was \$29,731,922. In 1917, the year when the collection of annual returns of dairy factories was commenced, the value of output was \$93,879,326, while in 1947, the latest year for which statistics are available, the value had mounted to \$352,373,109. This is a high record for the industry and it exceeds by \$82,067,603, the previous record, which was held by the product of the year 1946.

The per capita consumption of butter in Canada in 1947 is estimated at 27.96 pounds and the consumption of cheese at 5.25 pounds.

Mention might here be made of the product termed "Processed" cheese, which is made from ordinary cheddar cheese. The process is stated to consist essentially of grinding the cheese, heating it in a jacketed container with agitation and filling it into the proper receptables, either directly or with specially designed machinery. The cheese is pasteurized by the heat applied, and the effect is to check fermentation. A secret of the process is to apply this degree of heat and at the same time prevent the fat from "oiling off". The cheese is placed on the market in packages of one-half and one-quarter pound and is sold also in bulk. The product varies in firmness, ranging from soft cheese to the fairly solid cheese which can be sliced. In 1947, the production of processed cheese amounted to 39,387,323 pounds. Statistics of the industry are given on page 71 of the present volume.

DAIRY FACTORIESREPORTON THEDAIRY FACTORIES OF CANADA, 1947Introduction

The classification "dairy factory" embraces every factory having a production of butter, cheese, or concentrated milk (condensed milk, evaporated milk, milk powder, etc.). In the main tables of the report the creameries, cheese factories and combined butter and cheese factories are regarded as a whole, and the statistics are given, by counties and districts, under the general classification "butter and cheese factories". The introductory tables, which summarize the principal data, by provinces, give information for each of the groups separately, and also for the total of the three. Statistics of concentrated milk plants are shown separately in both main and introductory tables. The volume also contains statistics of the separately classified ice cream and processed cheese industries.

Creamery Butter and Factory Cheese

Creamery Butter:- The production of creamery butter in Canada in the year 1947 reached a total of 290,- 952,691 pounds. This amount shows an increase in production from the preceding year of 19,488,292 pounds or 7 per cent. The total value of the butter made in 1947 was \$152,935,070, an increase of \$47,493,669 from 1946. The average price per pound for the year was 52.56 cents compared with 38.84 cents in 1946. The relation which the production of each province bears to the total output is shown by the following percentages with the 1946 figures in brackets: Quebec, 33.5 (31.4); Ontario, 26.5 (25.5); Saskatchewan, 12.5 (13.7); Alberta, 11.0 (11.3); Manitoba, 9.0 (9.6); New Brunswick, 2.4 (2.5); Nova Scotia, 2.3 (2.6), British Columbia, 1.5 (2.0); Prince Edward Island, 1.3 (1.4). The production of butter shows an increase over 1946 in four provinces: Ontario, Quebec, Manitoba and Alberta.

Factory Cheese:- (a) The production of factory cheese in 1947 amounted to 123,337,530 pounds, a decrease from the year 1946 of 24,309,979 pounds or 16.5 per cent. The total value of the output was \$31,928,861. The average price per pound was 25.89 cents. Ontario is the chief cheese producing province, its output in 1947 representing 73 per cent of the total for Canada. Quebec is second in importance with 20 per cent of the total output and the remaining provinces, combined, contribute 7 per cent. No factory cheese is manufactured in Nova Scotia.

Tables 1 to 4 give the quantity, value and average price per pound of creamery butter and factory cheese, by provinces, for the years 1945 to 1947, and the production, value and average price per pound for Canada as a whole for the period 1900-1947. Table 4 is illustrated by the chart on page 8.




PRODUCTION AND VALUE OF CREAMERY BUTTER

Concentrated Milk.— The items under this classification are divided into two sections, i.e. concentrated whole-milk products and concentrated milk by-products. The production of concentrated whole-milk totalled 254,945,435 pounds in comparison with 241,188,718 pounds in 1946. The chief item in this classification is evaporated milk, the production of which amounted to 211,688,594 pounds. Condensed whole-milk is second in order of quantity, with 29,073,289 pounds. The by-products amounted to 76,837,017 pounds, compared with 59,113,958 pounds in 1946. The value of all items combined in 1947 was \$40,321,591, to which the whole-milk products contributed \$30,206,400, and the by-products \$10,115,191. Compared with the preceding year the total value shows an increase of \$7,641,074. For average prices of all items of concentrated whole-milk and by-products see Table 6 on the following page.

The industry is centred in Ontario, where are located 21 of the 31 plants in operation during the year. The remaining plants are located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 1; Quebec, 5; Alberta, 1; and British Columbia, 3. It should be noted that a small amount of concentrated milk is manufactured in creameries and this is included in the following table with the product of concentrated milk factories. In the general tables of the report the concentrated milk plants are placed in a separate group, as distinct from the butter and cheese factories.

DAIRY FACTORIES

Miscellaneous Products of Dairy Factories; - Comprised in this classification are, ice cream ice cream mix, whole milk and cream sold as such, chocolate milk and sundry items. The production of ice cream in dairy factories in 1947 amounted to 14,089,393 gallons, valued at \$18,260,344 but in addition to this quantity there was a production of 5,286,924 gallons, valued at \$6,869,993 in the separately classified ice cream industry, whose statistics are given on page 44 of this report and 1,633,403 gallons, valued at \$2,198,713 in the Confectionery, Cocoa and chocolate industry (a), making a total for the three combined of 21,009,720 gallons, valued at \$27,329,050 compared with 13,779,934 gallons, valued at \$16,956,139 in 1946. The value of milk sold as such was \$73,152,304 and of the cream \$24,314,313. The sales of milk and cream are compiled mainly from the returns of the city dairies; these dairies are engaged primarily in the distribution of milk and cream, but they also manufacture butter and ice cream and, being classified as creameries, are included in the annual census of dairy factories.

In the following table are given the quantities and value of the various kinds of miscellaneous products of dairy factories in the years 1945 to 1947.

TOTAL VALUE OF PRODUCTION

The value of output of the dairy factories in 1947 amounted to 352,373,109. This amount established a high record for the industry, to date. The increase over the year 1946 in the total value of production was \$82,067,603 or 30 per cent. The value of the manufactured products (butter, cheese, concentrated milk, ice cream, etc.) accounts for 72 per cent of the total value of output of the factories while the remaining 28 per cent covers the value of the milk and cream, whey cream, skim milk and buttermilk sold as such.

ESTABLISHMENTS AND PATRONS

Establishments. - The movement in favour of centralization in the industry has resulted in an almost continuous decline in the number of dairy factories, in contrast to the advance in production and the consequent rise in average value of output per plant. In 1917, the number of dairy factories in operation was 3,418, in 1927 it was 2,899 and by 1947 the number had decreased to 2,068. Meanwhile, the average value of output per plant had risen from \$27,466 in 1917 to \$170,393 in 1947. The number of factories in operation in 1947 comprised 1,143 creameries, 741 cheese factories, 153 combined butter and cheese factories and 31 condenseries.

Patrons. - The number of patrons (farmers who supply milk and cream to the dairy factories) for the year 1947 was 447,302, compared with 424,321 in 1946. These figures are based on the numbers recorded by the factories at date of July 1 in each year.

MILK AND CREAM DELIVERED TO DAIRY FACTORIES

Milk.- The milk delivered to all factories in 1947 amounted to 4,860,742,352 pounds, an increase from the preceding year of 32,635,486 pounds or 0.7 per cent. By percentage the total quantity is divided among the various kinds of factories as follows: to creameries 49 per cent; to cheese factories 27 per cent; to combined butter and cheese factories 5 per cent; and to concentrated milk factories 19 per cent.

Cream.- The cream delivered to the factories is measured according to its butter-fat content. In 1947 the total amount of butter-fat in the cream amounted to 224,405,280 pounds, an increase of 10,112,576 pounds from the year 1946. Of the total butter-fat content, the creameries received 96 per cent; the combined butter and cheese factories 3.6 per cent; and the concentrated milk plants 0.4 per cent.

The Milk Equivalent of the Total Deliveries of Milk and Cream.- The milk equivalent of the quantities of milk and butter-fat in cream delivered to the factories during the year 1947 was 11,272,321,752 pounds compared with 10,950,755,552 pounds in 1946. In reducing the butter-fat content of the cream to milk, the proportion of 3.5 pounds of butter-fat to 100 pounds of milk is used.

The bulk of the milk (including the equivalent in milk of the cream) is used in manufacture, but there is also a considerable quantity supplied to meet the requirements of the fresh milk and cream trade of the industry. In 1947 the manufacture of butter, cheese, concentrated milk and other manufactures absorbed 91 per cent of the total milk equivalent of the milk and cream delivered to the factories, while the equivalent of the milk and cream sold as such, accounts for the remaining 9 per cent.

AMOUNT PAID TO PATRONS

For the milk and cream delivered to the dairy factories during the year 1947, the patrons received the sum of \$251,891,811, an increase over the preceding year of \$64,222,824. The amount is divided by factory groups as follows: to patrons of creameries \$191,056,945 or 76 per cent; to patrons of cheese factories \$26,340,018 or 11 per cent; to patrons of combined butter and cheese factories \$10,415,767 or 4 per cent; and to patrons of concentrated milk plants \$24,079,081 or 9 per cent. The average price paid by the factories for the milk in 1947 was \$2.63 per 100 pounds and for the cream 55 cents per pound butter-fat content. In 1946 the average price paid for the milk was \$2.63 per 100 pounds and for the butter-fat 41 cents per pound.

The following table gives the total amounts paid to the patrons in the different factory groups, while in Table 4, page 32, the amounts paid for the milk and for the cream are shown separately.

Employees. - The total number of employees recorded in the dairy industry in 1947 was 22,326 and the amount paid in salaries and wages was \$35,062,174. The classification of "Salaried employees" comprises managers, superintendents, professional and clerical employees, salesmen, head makers, secretaries and the proprietor if he occupies himself in the establishment. The number of employees in this group in 1947 was 6,102 and the amount paid in salaries was \$9,067,791. The wage-earner classification comprises assistants, deliverers, journeymen and ordinary labourers. The total number of wage-earners for the year 1947 was 16,224 with wages \$25,994,383. Statistics of the two classifications by provinces, together with a record of the number of wage-earners by months, will be found in Table 2, page 30.

Form of Organization. - Dairy factories operated by individuals and partnerships contain the largest group in this classification with a total of 934 plants. The co-operative plant as applied to the dairy factories has gained steadily and the number of plants operated under this form of organization has advanced to 731 plants. Quebec leads the provinces with respect to co-operatives, with a total of 424 plants, while Ontario is second with 131 plants. The remaining group in the classification by form of organization is operated by incorporated companies and this group shows a total of 403 plants. Tableau VIII, page 43.

DAIRY FACTORIESTHE ICE CREAM INDUSTRY

The manufacture of ice cream in plants other than dairy factories and confectionery establishments is classified under the name of "ice cream industry". The number of plants contained in the group in 1947 was 85, distributed by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 5; New Brunswick, 2; Quebec, 15; Ontario, 47; Manitoba, 1; Saskatchewan, 1; Alberta, 4 and British Columbia, 10.

A separate report covering the production of ice cream in all industrial groups, is published at a later date.

The value of output of the industry in 1947 was \$8,046,328, an increase from the preceding year of \$2,719,828. The production of ice cream amounted to 5,286,924 gallons, valued at \$6,869,993, compared with 3,573,662 gallons, valued at \$4,310,532 in 1946. The industry produced, also, such miscellaneous items as: ice cream mix, ice cream novelties, chocolate and other prepared milk drinks, frozen confections, etc.

Statistics of the industry, for Canada as a whole are given in the following table. The statistics here-with presented are not included in the statistics of dairy factories.

INDUSTRIE DE LA CRÈME GLACÉE

La fabrication de crème glacée dans les établissements autres que les fabriques laitières et les confiseries est classifiée sous le nom de "industrie de la crème glacée". Le nombre d'établissements de ce groupe en 1947 est de 85 ainsi répartis entre les provinces: Nouvelle-Ecosse, 5; Nouveau-Brunswick, 2; Québec, 15; Ontario, 47; Manitoba, 1; Saskatchewan, 1; Alberta, 4; et Colombie-Britannique, 10.

Un rapport séparé sur la production de crème glacée, dans tous les groupes industriels est publié plus tard.

La valeur de la production de l'industrie en 1947 est de \$8,046,328, augmentation de \$2,719,828 sur l'année précédente. La production de crème glacée s'établit à 5,286,924 gallons d'une valeur de \$6,869,993, comparativement à 3,573,662 gallons d'une valeur de \$4,310,532 en 1946. L'industrie produit aussi d'autres items tels que: mélange pour crème glacée, glaces de fantaisie, lait chocolaté et autres breuvages préparés au lait, confiseries glacées, etc.

Les statistiques de l'industrie pour tout le Canada sont données dans le tableau suivant. Les chiffres présentés ici ne sont pas contenus dans les statistiques des fabriques laitières.

FABRIQUES LAITIÈRESTHE PROCESSED CHEESE INDUSTRY

The number of plants manufacturing processed cheese in 1947 was 22, located by provinces as follows: Quebec, 8; Ontario, 8; Manitoba, 3; Saskatchewan, 1, and Alberta, 2.

The quantity of processed cheese manufactured during the year amounted to 39,387,323 pounds, valued at \$14,367,406, an increase in quantity over the preceding year of 5,336,305 pounds, or 15.7 per cent, and in increase in value of \$3,512,896, or 32.4 per cent. Other products of the industry include cottage cheese, egg powder, mayonnaise, salad dressing, sandwich spread, etc.; and the value of these items in 1947 was \$7,285,-015. The total value of output of the industry (cheese and miscellaneous items) was \$21,652,421, apportioned by provinces as follows: Quebec, \$9,902,322, or 46 per cent; Ontario, \$8,222,008, or 38 per cent; and the other provinces combined, \$3,528,091 or 16 per cent.

The cheese is used chiefly for the home market, only a small quantity being exported each year.

The principal statistics of the industry in the year 1947 are given in the following table.

INDUSTRIE DU FROMAGE COMPOSÉ

Le nombre de fabriques de fromage composé en 1947 est de 22, réparties ainsi entre les provinces: Québec, 8; Ontario, 8; Manitoba, 3; Saskatchewan, 1; et Alberta, 2.

La production de fromage composé durant l'année est de 39,387,323 livres d'une valeur de \$14,367,406, augmenté de 5,336,305 livres ou 15.7 p. 100 sur l'année précédente. La valeur augmente de \$3,512,896 ou 32.4 p. 100. Les autres produits de l'industrie comprennent le fromage cottage, œufs en poudre, la mayonnaise, les préparations pour salade et pour sandwich, etc. La valeur de ces items en 1947 est de \$7,285,015. La valeur globale de la production de cette industrie (fromage et produits divers) est de \$21,652,421 répartie entre les provinces de la façon suivante: Québec, \$9,902,322 ou 46 p. 100; Ontario, \$8,222,008 ou 38 p. 100; autres provinces réunies \$3,528,-091 ou 16 p. 100.

Le fromage est vendu surtout sur le marché domestique, une petite quantité seulement étant exportée chaque année.

P R E F A C E

Les statistiques annuelles de l'industrie laitière sont publiées par le Bureau fédéral de la statistique en collaboration avec les ministères provinciaux de l'Agriculture. Les dispositions prises en vue de cette collaboration s'étendent à toutes les provinces, mais les méthodes de celles-ci diffèrent en ce qui concerne le relevé des données. Le Bureau fédéral imprime une formule uniforme pour toutes les provinces; dans l'Île du Prince-Edouard, le Nouveau-Brunswick, la Saskatchewan, l'Alberta et la Colombie-Britannique, les formules sont distribuées et les rapports recueillis et revisés par les commissaires provinciaux de l'industrie laitière qui les communiquent ensuite au Bureau pour analyse. Les statistiques ainsi obtenues sont mises ensuite à la disposition des ministères tant fédéraux que provinciaux. En Nouvelle-Ecosse, en Ontario et au Manitoba, les formules sont distribuées et les relevés recueillis, revisés et calculés par le Bureau fédéral tandis que le ministère provincial de l'Agriculture fournit les listes des fabriques laitières. Le Bureau des Statistiques de Québec recueille et calcule les chiffres et envoie les résultats de ses calculs au Bureau fédéral; les originaux des rapports des fabriques laitières sont mis aussi à la disposition du Bureau fédéral.

Ces dispositions, tout en assurant l'uniformité des statistiques laitières publiées par les gouvernements du Dominion et des provinces, épargnent aux fabricants la nécessité de répondre à deux questionnaires.

De plus, les techniciens de la Division des produits laitiers du ministère fédéral de l'Agriculture collaborent de leurs conseils dans les détails techniques.

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TABLEAUX D'ENSEMBLE

FABRIQUES LAITIÈRESL'INDUSTRIE LAITIERE AU CANADA.

L'industrie laitière est l'une des industries les plus anciennes et les plus importantes du Canada. Le système de fabriques au Canada a été introduit en 1864 lors de l'établissement de la première fromagerie canadienne; la première crèmeerie à fabriquer du beurre fut fondée dans le Québec en 1873. La première écrémuseuse centrifuge fut importée du Danemark en 1882 et l'Etat organisa en 1895 les services d'entreposage frigorifique. En 1868, le Canada exporta 6,141,570 livres de fromage et 10,649,733 livres de beurre. L'exportation de fromage prit dans la suite beaucoup d'ampleur, mais celle de beurre ne fit que des progrès modestes. Les exportations de fromage atteignent leur plus haut niveau en 1904 avec 233,980,716 livres et celles de beurre, en 1903, avec 34,128,944 livres.

Le déclin dans les exportations de beurre et de fromage les années suivantes s'explique par l'accroissement de la consommation domestique qui, depuis le commencement du siècle,^{1/} a accompagné l'expansion progressive de la population urbaine. Ce phénomène eut pour effet de stimuler la demande de lait entier et de substituer la fabrication de beurre pour consommation domestique à celle de fromage d'exportation. Il y a également eu augmentation dans la production de lait concentré qui comprend le lait condensé, le lait évaporé, la poudre de lait, etc. Le premier établissement de ce genre fut établit à Truro, N.-E., en 1883, et aujourd'hui l'on en compte trente et un.

Aide du gouvernement. - Le gouvernement fédéral, par l'entremise des ministères de l'Agriculture et du Commerce, contribue de diverses façons à encourager l'industrie laitière. La Division des produits laitiers accomplit ce travail pour le ministère fédéral de l'Agriculture. Ces principales attributions, qui consistent avant tout à aider le fermier, se partagent ainsi:

Service des marchés. - Un rapport hebdomadaire analyse la situation des marchés de Montréal, Toronto et New-York; là sont consignées toutes les transactions de marchés locaux de l'Ontario et du Québec. Les fonctionnaires provinciaux de l'industrie laitière sont informés par télégramme de l'état des marchés, de façon à pouvoir transmettre ces renseignements aux intéressés des différentes provinces. Tout individu peut profiter de ce système d'information télégraphique en acquittant les frais de la dépêche. Deux lettres sont publiées chaque mois; une sur l'industrie laitière et l'autre sur les entrepôts frigorifiques, en plus de bulletins qui paraissent à intervalles irréguliers.

Classement. - Comme le beurre et le fromage de fabrique ne peuvent être exportés sans classement préalable, des inspecteurs ont été nommés à cette fin dans divers centres du Dominion; toute province, désirant rendre obligatoire la classification du beurre destiné à la consommation domestique, peut le faire en adoptant une loi autorisant le gouvernement fédéral à appliquer le règlement 28 de sa loi sur l'industrie laitière. Ce règlement a été mis en vigueur en Colombie-Britannique et en Alberta, le 1er mai 1935; en Saskatchewan et au Manitoba, le 1er juin 1935; en Ontario, le 1er septembre 1936; dans le Québec et le Nouveau-Brunswick le 1er juin 1937.

Wagons frigorifiques. - (a) Des dispositions ont été prises pour que, de juin à septembre inclus, et sur certaines voies convergeant vers Toronto, Montréal, Québec et Halifax, les expéditions d'oeufs et de beurre puissent se faire par wagons-glacières. Ces derniers sont soumis à l'inspection dès leur arrivée à destination. (b) Par suite d'une entente avec les différents chemins de fer, le fromage d'exportation s'expédie également en wagons-glacières à Montréal, Québec et Halifax.

Inspection des cargaisons. - Des inspecteurs de cargaisons sont préposés aux ports canadiens de Montréal, Québec, Vancouver et Halifax, et pendant les mois d'hiver, au port de St-John, N.-B. Un service d'inspection est aussi maintenu à Londres, Southampton, Liverpool, Manchester et Glasgow, dans le Royaume-Uni.

Surveillant des fabriques de lait condensé. - Des fonctionnaires font périodiquement la tournée de toutes les fabriques de lait condensé, évaporé ou desséché, aidant ces différentes entreprises de leurs avis techniques; ils examinent également les produits manufacturés pour se rendre compte qu'ils sont conformes aux étalons de composition et de poids.

Recherches. - Etude des imperfections dans la qualité des produits laitiers et remèdes proposés.

Service de l'utilisation du lait. - Un personnel de diététiciens expérimentés est employé à donner des démonstrations et des causeries sur la valeur du lait et de ses produits dans l'alimentation.

Subventions aux entrepôts frigorifiques. - En vertu des dispositions de la loi des entrepôts frigorifiques, le gouvernement peut s'entendre par contrat avec des personnes ou des compagnies pour subventionner la construction d'entrepôts frigorifiques publics.

1/ En 1940, à la suite de la demande créée par la guerre, les exportations de produits laitiers se remettent à la hausse et maintiennent leur niveau élevé jusqu'en 1943 mais baissent ensuite légèrement en 1944. Les produits principaux qui se partagent cette augmentation sont le fromage et le lait condensé et évaporé.

FABRIQUES LAITIERES

Primes aux producteurs primaires de lait et de gras de beurre. - Le gouvernement a recouru aux primes pour encourager le maintien ou l'augmentation durant la guerre et la période de transition de la fabrication de produits laitiers essentiels. Ces primes ont été versées sous la direction de l'Office du ravitaillement en produits agricoles alimentaires. En 1945, une prime de 10 cents la livre a été payée aux producteurs pour le gras de beurre employé dans la fabrication de beurre de crème. Une prime de 20 cents le cent livres de lait utilisé dans la fabrication de fromage cheddar a été payée du 1er janvier au 30 avril 1946. Du 1er mai au 31 décembre 1946, la prime a été de 30 cents le cwt. Les producteurs de lait pour fins de concentration ont également reçu une prime à l'échelle suivante: du 1er janvier au 30 avril, 30 cents le cent livres et du 1er mai au 30 septembre, 15 cents le cent livres. La prime a été supprimée le 1er octobre 1946. Les fabricants ont agi comme agents du gouvernement pour le paiement de ces primes.

Programme de stabilisation. - Afin de contrôler l'utilisation du lait l'Office du ravitaillement en produits agricoles alimentaires a arrêté un programme de stabilisation le 1er octobre 1943. En vertu de ce programme, les fabricants et les distributeurs devaient obtenir la permission de l'Office avant de pouvoir acheter du lait ou de la crème de producteurs autres que ceux desquels ils en achetaient régulièrement avant le 30 septembre 1943. Cette règle a été discontinue le 31 octobre 1945.

Le ministère de l'Agriculture a payé en 1947 une prime d'un cent la livre sur tout le fromage cheddar de 93 points produit au Canada, et une prime de deux cents sur le fromage de 94 points ou plus. Le ministère de l'Agriculture s'est aussi engagé ces dernières années à encourager la fusion de petites fromageries pour former des fromageries plus grandes en versant une subvention de 50 pour cent du coût de la transformation lorsque deux fromageries ou plus s'unissent.

Le prix du fromage exporté au ministère britannique des Vivres en vertu des engagements de 1947-1948 et qui était fixé d'après la base de 25 cents la livre, première qualité, f.a.b., point d'expédition à la fabrique, n'a pas été augmenté par le gouvernement canadien au-delà de la prime régulière dont il est question dans le paragraphe précédent de ce rapport. La province d'Ontario a maintenu les primes sur le fromage en 1947, mais seulement pour la période où il était requisitionné par le ministère des Vivres. La province de Québec a discontinue le versement de primes sur le fromage de première qualité le 1er décembre 1942, et ce n'est que le 1er juillet 1943 qu'elles ont été de nouveau introduites et maintenues jusqu'à la fin de l'année civile. Québec a discontinue le 1er novembre 1944.

La Commission des produits laitiers est venue en aide au marché du beurre au cours de l'année civile 1947 en achetant du beurre aux prix minimums établis. (a)

Le ministère du Commerce prête surtout son concours pour l'écoulement du fromage et du beurre sur les marchés étrangers, le contrôle des importations et la publication des statistiques.

Les renseignements relatifs à la production du lait sur les fermes canadiennes ont été réunis pour la première fois lors du recensement de 1911 (l'analyse portant sur la production de l'année 1910); une estimation toutefois avait été faite en 1900 qui établissait la production de l'année à 6,866,834,000 livres. En 1910 (recensement) la production laitière s'élève à 9,806,741,348 livres, en 1920 (recensement) à 10,976,235,351 livres, en 1930 (recensement) à 12,854,323,094 livres et en 1940 (recensement) à 15,648,785,757, augmentation de 128 p. 100 depuis le début du siècle. La production laitière au Canada en 1947 est estimée à 17,240,788,000 livres. (b)

Les statistiques de ce rapport embrassent uniquement la production des fabriques laitières; elles ne comprennent ni le beurre ni le fromage dits "de ferme". Le recensement de 1941 indique que la production de beurre de ferme en 1940 fut de 81,701,486 livres et celle de fromage de ferme, de 808,034 livres, ces quantités représentant respectivement 24 et 0.6 p. 100 des totaux. Une estimation faite par la Branche de l'agriculture du Bureau fédéral de la Statistique établit la production de beurre de ferme en 1947 à 56,295,000 livres et celle de fromage de ferme à 740,000 livres.

Il existe des statistiques complètes sur la production des fabriques laitières depuis 1900. La valeur totale des produits laitiers s'établissait alors à \$29,731,922. En 1917, année d'inauguration des rapports annuels sur les fabriques laitières, la valeur de la production était de \$93,879,326, tandis qu'en 1947, l'année la plus récente pour laquelle les statistiques sont connues, elle s'élève à \$352,373,109. C'est un chiffre sans précédent pour cette industrie; il dépasse par plus de \$82,067,603 le maximum de 1946.

La consommation de beurre par bouche au Canada en 1947 est estimée à 27.96 livres, et la consommation de fromage à 5.25 livres.

Il est à propos de mentionner ici le produit appelé fromage "composé" fabriqué avec du cheddar ordinaire. Le procédé consiste essentiellement à broyer le fromage, le chauffer au bain-marie en l'agitant et le verser ensuite dans des récipients appropriés, soit directement, soit au moyen d'un dispositif spécial. La chaleur qui l'a pasteurisé en a en même temps interrompu la fermentation. Un des secrets du procédé consiste à soumettre le fromage à la chaleur voulue et empêcher le gras de tourner en huile. Le fromage est ensuite livré au marché en paquets d'une demi-livre et d'un quart de livre ou en meules. Il varie en fermeté, passant du fromage tendre au fromage passablement solide qui peut être tranché. En 1947, la production de fromage composé s'élève à 39,387,323 livres. Les statistiques de cette industrie sont données à la page 71 du présent volume.

FABRIQUES LAITIÈRESRAPPORTSUR LESFABRIQUES LAITIÈRES AU CANADA, 1947Introduction

L'expression "fabrique laitière" désigne toute fabrique produisant du beurre, du fromage ou du lait concentré (condensé, évaporé, en poudre, etc.). Dans les tableaux d'ensemble de ce rapport, les crèmeries, les fromageries, et les beurreries-fromageries sont considérées dans l'ensemble, et sous la rubrique générale "beurreries et fromageries" sont données les statistiques par comté et district. Les tableaux provisoires qui constituent un résumé des principales données, par province, présentent séparément les détails de chaque catégorie de même que le total des trois. Les statistiques des condenserries sont données séparément dans les tableaux généraux et dans les tableaux provisoires. Le rapport contient également des statistiques des deux industries distinctes de la crème glacée et du fromage composé.

Beurre de crèmerie et fromage de fabrique

Beurre de crèmerie:- La production de beurre de crèmerie au Canada en 1947 atteint 290,952,691 livres, augmentation de 19,488,292 livres ou 7 p. 100 sur l'année précédente. La valeur totale de la production de beurre en 1947 s'élève à \$152,935,070, augmentation de \$47,493,669 sur 1946. Le prix moyen par livre pour l'année est de 52.56 cents comparé à 38.4 cents en 1946. La production de chaque province proportionnellement au total est la suivante, avec les pourcentages de 1946 entre parenthèses: Québec, 33.5 (31.4); Ontario, 26.5 (25.5); Saskatchewan, 12.5 (13.7); Alberta, 11.0 (11.3); Manitoba, 9.0 (9.6); Nouveau-Brunswick, 2.4 (2.5); Nouvelle-Écosse, 2.3 (2.6); Colombie-Britannique, 1.5 (2.0); île du Prince-Édouard, 1.3 (1.4). La fabrication de beurre accuse une augmentation sur 1946 dans quatre province, l'Ontario, le Québec, le Manitoba et l'Alberta.

Fromage de fabrique:- (a) La production de fromage de fabrique en 1947 atteint 123,337,530 livres, diminution de 24,309,979 livres ou 16.5 p. 100 sur 1946. La valeur totale de la production s'élève à \$31,928,861. Le prix moyen par livre est de 25.89 cents. L'Ontario est la plus grande province productrice et sa production en 1947 représente 73 p. 100 du total pour le Canada. Le Québec se classe deuxième avec 20 p. 100 de la production totale tandis que les autres provinces ensemble contribuent 7 p. 100. La Nouvelle-Écosse ne fabrique pas de fromage.

Les tableaux 1 à 4 ci-après donnent la quantité, la valeur et le prix moyen du beurre de crèmerie et du fromage de fabrique, par province, de 1945 à 1947, et la production, la valeur et le prix moyen la livre pour tout le Canada, de 1900 à 1947. Le tableau 4 est illustré par un graphique à la page 54.





Lait concentré. - Les articles qui paraissent sous cette rubrique sont divisés en deux sections, i.e., les produits concentrés de lait entier et les sous-produits concentrés du lait. La production de lait entier concentré atteint 254,945,435 livres, contre 241,188,718 livres en 1946. Le principal article de ce classement est le lait évaporé, dont la production s'élève à 211,688,594 livres. La production de lait entier condensé arrive en deuxième lieu avec 29,073,289 livres. Les sous-produits s'établissent à 76,837,017 livres comparativement à 59,113,958 livres en 1946. La valeur de tous les articles réunis en 1947 est de \$40,321,591, dont \$30,206,400 pour les produits de lait entier et \$10,115,191 pour les sous-produits. La valeur totale de la production en 1947 accuse une augmentation de \$7,641,074 sur l'année précédente. Pour les prix moyens de tous les articles qui composent le lait entier concentré et les sous-produits, voir tableau 6 de la page suivante.

L'Ontario est le centre de cette industrie et compte 21 des 31 établissements exploités durant l'année. Les autres établissements se répartissent comme il suit, par province: Nouvelle-Écosse, 1; Québec, 5; Alberta, 1; et Colombie-Britannique, 3. Il importe de remarquer que les crèmeries produisent une petite quantité de lait concentré qui paraît dans le tableau qui suit avec la production des fabriques de lait concentré. Dans les tableaux d'ensemble de ce rapport, les établissements de lait concentré sont indiqués dans un groupe distinct par rapport aux beurries et aux fromageries.

FABRIQUE LAITIÈRES

Produits divers des fabriques laitières:- Ce groupe comprend la crème glacée, le mélange pour crème glacée, le lait entier et la crème vendue tels quels, le lait chocolaté et divers autres produits. La production de crème glacée dans les fabriques laitières en 1947 s'établit à 14,089,393 gallons d'une valeur de \$16,260,344. Il faut ajouter à cette quantité une production de 5,286,924 gallons d'une valeur de \$6,869,993 classée séparément dans l'industrie de la crème glacée et dont les statistiques sont données à la page 44 du présent rapport, et 1,633,403 gallons d'une valeur de \$2,198,713 dans l'industrie de la confiserie, du cacao et du chocolat (a), ce qui donne un total pour les trois quantités réunies de 21,-009,720 gallons d'une valeur de \$27,329,050 comparativement à 13,775,934 gallons d'une valeur de \$16,956,139 en 1946. La valeur du lait vendu comme tel est de \$73,152,304 et de la crème, \$24,314,513. Les chiffres des ventes de lait et de crème proviennent surtout des rapports des laiteries urbaines; ces laiteries s'occupent d'abord de la distribution de lait et de crème, mais fabriquent aussi du beurre et de la crème glacée. Elles sont donc classées comme crèmeries et figurent au recensement annuel des fabriques laitières.

VALEUR GLOBALE DE LA PRODUCTION

La valeur de la production des fabriques laitières en 1947 atteint \$352,373,109, soit le plus haut niveau jamais atteint par cette industrie. L'augmentation de la valeur globale de la production est de \$82,067,603 ou de 30 p. 100 sur 1946. La valeur de tous les produits réunis (beurre, fromage, lait concentré, crème glacée, etc.) représente 72 p. 100 de la valeur totale de la production des fabriques; le 28 p. 100 qui reste est la valeur du lait et de la crème, de la crème de petit lait, du lait écrémé et du lait de beurre vendus comme tels.

ETABLISSEMENTS ET PATRONS

Etablissements. - La tendance à la centralisation dans l'industrie résulte en une diminution presque constante du nombre de fabriques laitières au regard d'une augmentation de la production et partant, d'une hausse de la valeur moyenne de la production par établissement. En 1917, le nombre de fabriques laitières exploitées était de 3,418; en 1927, il est de 2,899. En 1947, il tombe à 2,068. Dans l'intervalle, la valeur moyenne de la production par établissement passe de \$27,466 en 1917 à \$170,393 en 1947. Le nombre de fabriques exploitées en 1947 comprend 1,143 crèmeries, 741 fromageries, 153 beurrieries-fromageries et 31 condenseries.

Patrons. - Le nombre de patrons (farmers qui fournissent le lait et la crème aux fabriques laitières) en 1947, est de 447,302, comparativement à 424,321 en 1946. Ces chiffres sont basés sur les relevés des fabriques le 1er juillet chaque année.

LAIT ET CRÈME LIVRÉS AUX FABRIQUES

Lait. - La quantité de lait livrée aux fabriques laitières en 1947 s'établit à 4,860,742,352 livres, augmentation de 32,635,486 livres ou 0.7 p. 100 sur l'année précédente. Voici comment se répartit la quantité totale entre les divers genres de fabriques: aux crèmeries, 49 p. 100; aux fromageries, 27 p. 100; aux beurseries-fromageries, 5 p. 100; et aux condenseries, 19 p. 100.

Crème. - La quantité de crème livrée aux fabriques se mesure selon sa teneur en gras de beurre. En 1947, la quantité globale de gras de beurre dans la crème s'élève à 224,405,280 livres, augmentation de 10,112,576 livres sur 1946. Les crèmeries ont reçu 96 p. 100 de la quantité totale de gras de beurre, les beurseries-fromageries, 3.6 p. 100 et les condenseries, 0.4 p. 100.

Équivalence en lait des livraisons globales de lait et de crème. - L'équivalent en lait des quantités de lait et de gras de beurre dans la crème livrée aux fabriques en 1947 est de 11,272,321,752 livres comparativement à 10,950,755,552 livres en 1946. Pour convertir en lait la teneur en gras de beurre de la crème, on emploie la proportion de 3.5 livres de gras par 100 livres de lait.

La majeure partie du lait (y compris l'équivalent en lait de la crème) est employée dans la fabrication, mais une quantité considérable sert aussi au commerce de la crème et du lait frais. En 1947, la fabrication de beurre, de fromage, de lait concentré et autres produits absorbe 91 p. 100 de l'équivalent en lait des livraisons de lait et de crème aux fabriques, tandis que le lait et la crème vendus comme tels absorbent les 9 p. 100 qui restent.

SOMMES VERSÉES AUX PATRONS

Les fabriques ont versé à leurs patrons en 1947, pour le lait et la crème livrés, la somme de \$251,891,811, augmentation de \$64,222,824 sur l'année précédente. Ce montant est réparti entre les divers groupes d'établissements de la façon suivante: aux patrons de crèmeries, \$191,056,945 ou 76 p. 100; aux patrons de fromageries, \$26,340,018 ou 11 p. 100; aux patrons de beurreries-fromageries, \$10,415,767 ou 4 p. 100; et aux patrons de condenseries, \$24,079,081 ou 9 p. 100. Le prix moyen payé par les fabriques pour le lait en 1947 est de \$2.63 le cent livre, soit le même qu'en 1946, et pour la crème, de 55 cents la livre de gras de beurre, contre 41 cents l'année précédente.
