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THE PROCESS CHEESE INDUSTRY, 1952

The total value of products shipped in 1952 was \$25,482,566. Allowing for changes in inventory, the estimated value of production is \$25,738,000, a decrease of 2 p.c. from the high point reached in 1951. The cost of materials used was \$20,346,838, a drop of 4 p.c. from the previous year but employment increased, the 1,050 persons reported being 5 p.c. over the 1951 figure. Salaries and wages, at \$2,816,857, were 21 p.c. higher.

The production of process cheese, the main product of the industry, was 40,571,092 lb., valued at \$15,927,278, while an additional 570,404 lb., valued at \$161,512, were made in the dairy factory industry, giving a total production of the commodity amounting to 41,141,496 lb., valued at \$16,088,790, or an increase of 4.5 p.c. in volume but a decrease of 0.7 p.c. in value as compared with 1951.
