

The process cheese industry recorded a new high point in the value of shipments, the \$29,392,633 reported for 1954 being 7.8 p.c. above the \$27,271,289 shown for 1953. The cost of materials, at \$22,890,147, was 5.7 p.c. above the 1953 figure. Employees numbered 1,292 with earnings of \$3,408,546, gains of 10.4 p.c. and 11.2 p.c., respectively, over the 1953 figures.

Process cheese, the principal product, accounted for \$18,565,687 or 63 p.c. of the total, cream cheese for \$1,324,469 or 5 p.c. and other products such as salad dressing, sandwich spread and margarine for \$9,502,477 or 32 p.c. The processing of types of cheese other than cheddar is increasing, having risen from 3 p.c. of the total cheese used in 1951 to 7 p.c. in 1954.
