THE PROCESS CHEESE INDUSTRY, 1956

The process cheese industry shipped goods to the value of \$27,434,586 in 1956, an increase of 8.5 p.c. over the \$25,280,990 reported for 1955. Taking changes of inventory into account, the value of production is estimated at \$27,470,119 and the value added by manufacture at \$5,368,139. The cost of materials, at \$21,931,375, was 9.7 p.c. higher than in the previous year. Employment, at 1,091 persons, was 7.9 p.c. lower but salary and wage payments, at \$3,513,810, were 3.3 p.c. higher.

Process cheese, the principal product, accounted for \$18,654,491 or 68.0 p.c. of the total value of shipments, cream cheese for \$1,500,898, or 5.5 p.c. and other products, such as salad dressing, sandwich spread and margarine, for \$7,279,197 or 26.5 p.c.
