# THE CONFECTIONERY INDUSTRY

## 1949

In 1949 reports were received from two hundred and eight establishments whose principal products were confectionery, cocoa, chocolate and chewing gum. These establishments produced goods to the value of \$99,424,355, gave employment to 10,317 employees, who were paid \$17,107,649 in salaries and wages, and expended \$51,001,165 for materials.

It should be noted that statistics for Newfoundland have been included with the 1949 tables. As there is only one establishment reporting, the figures have been included with those of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, in order to prevent disclosure of individual figures. The number of establishments reporting in 1949 was 208 and located by provinces as follows: Newfoundland, 1; Nova Scotia, 9; New Brunswick, 5; Quebec, 52; Ontario, 82; Manitoba, 14; Saskatchewan, 1; Alberta, 7; and British Columbia, 37.

A new method of collecting statistics from firms having a production of under \$50,000 was adopted this year. These establishments were required to furnish only the total value of products manufactured,

and from this figure, by using special statistical methods, an estimate was made for each of the small establishments, of the number of employees, salaries and wages paid, as well as materials used. These estimates cannot be far out as the total production of the 106 firms was \$1,818,678 or less than two per cent of the total production.

The output of the confectionery, cocoa and chocolate industries declined in 1949. The decrease in the gross value of production amounted to \$3,261,908 or 3.3 per cent. The cost of materials used, decreased from \$56,396,133 to \$51,001,165 or 9.6 per cent.

To bring the industry in line with the Standard Classification currently used in the Bureau, the confectionery, cocoa, chocolate and chewing gum industries were separated from the biscuit and ice cream cone industry. However, to maintain the historical trend of the combined industries a table is included showing the principal statistics for the biscuit, ice cream, confectionery and chewing gum industries as a unit.
