

# THE CONFECTIONERY INDUSTRY

## 1950

In 1950 reports were received from two hundred and seven establishments whose principal products were confectionery, cocoa, chocolate and chewing gum. These establishments produced goods to the value of \$104,853.748, gave employment to 10,854 employees, who were paid \$18,451,058 in salaries and wages, and expanded \$54,520,295 for materials.

It should be noted that statistics for Newfoundland have been included with the 1950 tables. As there is only one establishment reporting, the figures have been included with those of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. In order to prevent disclosure of individual figures. The number of establishments reporting in 1950 was 207 and located by provinces as follows: Newfoundland, 2; Nova Scotia, 8; New Brunswick, 5; Quebec, 52; Ontario, 82; Manitoba, 12; Saskatchewan, 1; Alberta, 9; and British Columbia, 36.

A new method of collecting statistics from firms having a production of under \$50,000 was adopted last year. These establishments were required to furnish only the total value of products manufactured,

and from this figure, by using special statistical methods, an estimate was made for each of the small establishments, of the number of employees, salaries and wages paid, as well as materials used. These estimates cannot be far out as the total production of the 98 firms was \$1,365,405 or less than two per cent of the total production.

The output of the confectionery, cocoa and chocolate industries increased in 1950. The increase in the gross value of production amounted to \$5,428,393 or 5.2 per cent. The cost of materials used, increased from \$51,001,165 to \$54,520,295 or 6.9 per cent.

To bring the industry in line with the Standard Classification currently used in the Bureau, the confectionery, cocoa, chocolate and chewing gum industries were separated from the biscuit and ice cream cone industry. However, to maintain the historical trend of the combined industries a table is included showing the principal statistics for the biscuit, ice cream, confectionery and chewing gum industries as a unit.
