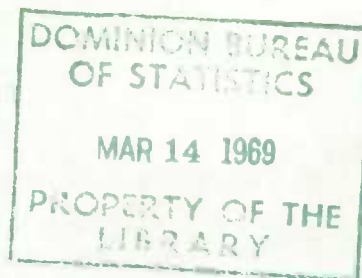

SPECIFICATIONS AND DEFINITIONS OF SELECTED PRODUCTS AS SHOWN IN TABLE 13

1. Chewing Gum
Units of coated and uncoated chewing gum, bubble gum and specialty type gums.
2. Cocoa Powder for Sale
Chocolate from which part of the cacao butter has been removed. It is unsweetened and includes breakfast cocoa, low fat cocoa and loose powders (also known as proprietary cocoa). Do not include powder produced for own use.
3. Cooking Chocolate
Chocolate marketed as domestic cooking and baking ingredient, e.g. chocolate liquor in consumer packages, chocolate chips, sweet or semi-sweet chocolate and chocolate vermicelli in consumer packages.
4. Coatings
(a) Chocolate. - Include chocolate liquor in slabs used for industrial purposes; dark or light (sweetened) chocolate. Mixed with sugar or combinations of sugar, dextrose, milk, cocoa butter and other flavouring materials.
(b) Synthetic coatings; exclude chocolate coatings defined in para. 4(a) but include ice cream chocolate and pastes, flavoured baking chips, confectioners' coatings and all other imitation chocolate which is not defined as chocolate under government regulations.
5. Chocolate Confectionery
Include pounds of (i) bars and (ii) packages under 2 lb. when the chocolate ingredient is 60 per cent or more by net weight and consists of solid, light milk and dark chocolate confectionery with ingredients such as nuts, cocoanut, raisins, etc., or centres of caramel, butterscotch, cream, marshmallow, nuts etc., provided the weight of these ingredients or centres is less than 40 per cent of the net weight of the finished product. Does not include penny goods.
6. Chocolate Confectionery, Coated
Include pounds of (i) bars and (ii) packages under 2 lb. when the chocolate ingredient is less than 60 per cent of the net weight and consists of chocolate confectionery enrobed in light milk or dark chocolate with ingredients such as nuts, cocoanut, raisins, etc., or centres of caramel, butterscotch, cream, marshmallow, nuts, etc., provided the weight of these ingredients or centres is more than 40 per cent of the net weight of the finished product. Does not include penny goods.
7. Chocolate Bulk, Solid and Coated
Includes solid or coated chocolate confectionery (bulk). These units will be of the type described in items 5 and 6, but they must be packed in units of 2 lb. and over. Includes imperfect goods.
8. Chocolates, Boxed
Include solid and coated chocolate confectionery in boxes of paper, paperboard, tin, etc. These units must be confectionery types as described in 5 and 6 above.
9. Sugar Confectionery
Includes products of pure sugar at the unit prices specified and includes units (bars, packages, boxed or bulk) other than chocolate confectionery; e.g. candy toffee, caramels, lozenges (non medicated), licorice, drops, rolls, peanut brittle, pralines, etc., but excludes penny goods.
10. Penny Goods
Includes solid, coated and sugar confectionery which is usually dispensed by the retailer at 2¢ or less per unit.
11. Seasonal Novelties
Includes all confectionery novelties such as Easter eggs, chickens, hens, rabbits, etc., whether chocolate coated, marshmallow centres or hollow goods.

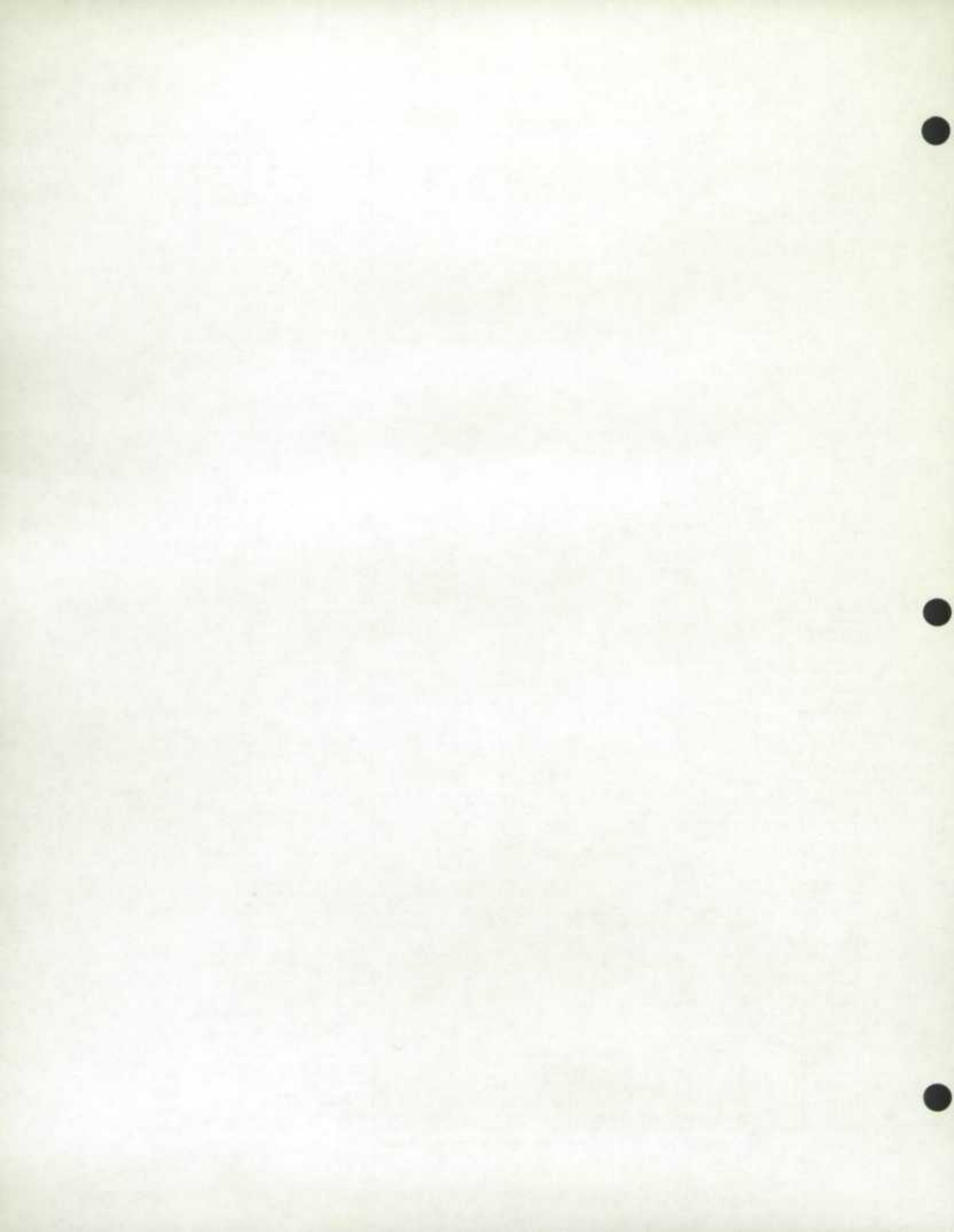
