THE AWNING, TENT AND SAIL INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1935.
A leport is presented herewith covering the awning, tent and sail industry in Canalia for the year 1933. Reports were received from sixty establishments which was an increase of four over the number reporting in 1932.

The sixty establishments had a gross value of production of $\$ 1,251,063$, an increase of $\$ 76,097$. The capital investment showed a decline of $\$ 84,830$. There were ten more persons employed but their salaries and wages decreased by $\$ 40,635$. The cost of materials was higher by $\$ 70,994$, whilst the value added by manufacture rose to the extent of $\$ 5,103$. These actual variations in the principal statistics for 1933 in comparison with 1932 are shown, by provinces, in the following table.

## THE AWNING, TENT AND SAIL INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1933

The principal item of production during 1933 was "awnings, all kinds", the output of which amounted to 31,122 with a selling value of $\$ 317,586$. Next in order of importance were "tents, all kinds" with 19,885 valued at $\$ 266,502$. Covers for various purposes occupy third place with a valuation of $\$ 124,488$, followed by "window blinds" worth ${ }^{\$ 1} 78,404$. Items of production are given in detail for the years 1932 and 1933 in table 3.

Duck was the chief component material used of which 944,073 lineal yards were consumed at a cost of 213,348 . Awning stripe follows next in order with 283,678 lineal yards costing $\$ 94,846$, whilst canvas occupies third position with 166,807 lineal yards with a cost value of $\$ 53,054$. Detailed statistics covering materials used are shown for the two year period, 1932-1933, in table 4.

The average number of wage-earners increased by thirteen ani the maximum number at employment during the year was 414 in the month of June. The minimum number reported was 230 in the month of December.

Imports are quite small, the total amount for the calendar yeur only amounted to $\$ 3,240$, which was a decrease of $\$ 2,328$ over 1932

Exports are also negligeable, the value falling from \$3,150 in 1932 to $\$ 1,451$ in 1933 , a decline of $\$ 1,699$. Details of imports and exports are shown for the year's 1932 and 1933, by countries, in tables 11 and 12.
