THE AWNING, TENT AND SAIL INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1934.

In 1934 reports were received from sixty-two establishments whose principal products were awnings, tents, sails, waterproof covers, etc. This was an increase of two when compared with the number reporting in 1933.

The improved business conditions in this industry, which first became apparent in 1933, continued throughout 1934. The gross value of production increased by \$369,100 or over 29 per cent, rising from \$1,251,063 in 1933 to \$1,620,163 in 1934. The number of persons engaged in the industry rose from 434 to 466, or more than 7 per cent, while the remuneration they received was \$398,808, or almost 6 per cent more than in 1933. The cost of materials used also advanced from \$633,532 to \$871,533 or more than 3 per cent, while the value added by manufacture increased by \$748,630 or over 2 per cent as compared with the previous year. The capital invested, however, showed a slight decline, decreasing from \$1,563,084 to \$1,554,337, or less than 1 per cent, the decline being mainly due to charges for depreciation.

The actual variations in the principal statistics for 1934 in comparison with 1933 are shown, by provinces, in the following table.

This industry is centered mainly in Ontario and Quebec, with thirty establishments in the former and eleven in the latter province. The remainder are located as follows: - Nova Scotia four, New Brunswick one, Manitoba five, Saskatchewan two, Alberta three and British Columbia six. Ontario, in its thirty establishments, employed over 44 per cent of the total capital, 48 per cent of the total employees and produced over 50 per cent of the total value of the output. In the eleven Quebec establishments are employed approximately 25 per cent of the capital, 24 per cent of the total employees, and in these are produced approximately 24 per cent of the total

value of the output.

During 1934 the principal item of production was "awnings, all kinds", the output of which numbered 49,872 valued at \$389,868. "Tents, all kinds" were next in order of importance with 20,746 and a selling value at the factory of \$343,090. Covers of various kinds took third place in production with a value of \$183,054, and were followed by "window blinds" with \$92,278. Other items of production are given in detail in table 3.

The chief component material used was duck to the extent of 1,211,075 yards costing \$315,571. Next in order follows awning stripe of which the consumption was 354,247 yards costing \$125,038, whilst canvas with 187,948 yards costing \$54,061 occupied third place. Further details of the materials used are shown in table 4.

June was the month of maximum employment, during which time 481 persons were engaged, while January recorded the minimum with only 202 employees.

Neither imports nor exports of the products or raw materials of this industry are of great importance. Imports in 1934 totalled \$5,124 and consisted of sails from the United Kingdom. The exports in that year amounted to only \$2,696.
