THE AWNING, TENT AND SALL INDUSTRX IN CANADA, 1938

In 1938 reports were received from seventy establishments whose principal products were awnings, tents, sails, waterproof covers. These establishments produced goods to the value of $\$ 1,934,596$, they gave employment to 588 persons, paid out in salaries and wages the sum of $\$ 556,088$ and expended $\$ 957,284$ for materials. Capital invested amounted to $\$ 1,943,117$.

Compared with the previous year, the gross value of production in 1938 de creased by $\$ 260,265$ or 11.8 per cent, 41 fewer persons were given employment, a decrease of 6.5 per cent, and salaries and wages paid decreased by $\$ 12,123$ or 2.1 per cent. Expenditure for materials was smaller by $\$ 198,445$ or 17 ol per cent. Working capital, comprising the inventory value of materials on hand, stocks in process, finished products, etc. and cash, trading and operating accounts, etc., decreased by approximately l. 4 per cent, and fixed capital, representing the present value of land, buildings, fixtures, etc., also declined to the extent of $\$ 30,814$ or 3.2 per cent.

Ontario, with 36 establishments, accounted for 45 per cent of the total. capital, 48 per cent of the employees and 50 per cent of the gross value of production. The 11 Quebec establishments reported 24 per cent of the capital invested, 23 per cent of the employment given and 22 per cent of the gross value of the output. The remainder of the establishments were located as follows: Nova Scotia 3, New Brunswick 2, Manítoba 4, Saskatchewan 2, Alberta 4 and British Columbia 8.

The principal item of production was "awaings, all kinds", the output of which numbered 46,117 valued at $\$ 487,156$. "Tents, all kinds", with a value of $\$ 327,246$ came next in order of importance. "Covers, all kinds" were valued at $\$ 174,856$ and "bags" at $\$ 150,776$. Other items of production are show in Table 3.

The chief material, duck, was used to the extent of 929,419 yards valued at $\$ 275,700$. Awning stripe, 428,820 yards valued at $\$ 142,564$ was the second most important material. For further details see Table 4.

June, with 552 persons reported, and January, with 326 represented respectively the months of maximum and minimum employment of wage-earners.
