THE AWNING, TENT AND SAIL INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1939

In 1939 reports were received from seventy establishments whose principal products were awnings, tents, sails, waterproof covers. These establishments produced goods to the value of $\$ 2,356,610$, they gave employment to 645 persons, paid out in salaries and wages the sum of $\$ 617,529$ and expended $\$ 1,307,951$ for materials. Capital invested amounted to $\$ 2,150,637$.

The output of the awning, tent and sail industry was considerably higher in 1939. There were increases of $\$ 422,014$ or 22 per cent in the gross value of production, 57 in the number of persons employed, $\$ 61,441$ in the salaries and wages paid, $\$ 70,066$ in the value added by manufacture, and $\$ 207,520$ in the capital invested. Of the increase in the capital $\$ 46,366$ was in fixed and $\$ 151,154$ in working capital.

Ontario, with 37 establishments, accounted for 45 per cent of the total capital, 49 per cent of the employees and 50 per cent of the gross value of production. The 12 Quebec establishments reported 27 per cent of the caijital invested, 23 per cent of the employment given and 26 per cent of the gross value of the output. The remainder of the establishments were located as follows: Nova Scotia 3, New Brunswick 2, Manitoba 4, Saskatchewan 2, Alberta 4 and British Columbia 6.

The principal item of production was "awnings, all kinds", the output of which numbered 41,129 valued at $\$ 432,830$. "Tents, all kinds", with a value of $\$ 346,874$ came next in order of importance. "Covers, all kinds" were valued at $\$ 236,798$, "bags" at $\$ 234,512$, and "flags and bunting" at $\$ 178,329$. It is interesting to note that the production of flags and bunting in 1939 was $\$ 101,356$ higher than in the previous year. This no doubt was due to the increased demand for decorations occasioned by the visit of the King and Queen in the spring of 1939. For details of production see Table 3.

June with 606 persons reported and January with 325 represented respectively the months of maximum and minimum employment of wage-earners.

For imports and exports see Tables 11 and 12.
