

THE AWNING, TENT AND SAIL INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1943

In 1943 reports were received from seventy-seven establishments whose principal products were awnings, tents, sails, bags, waterproof covers. These establishments, produced goods to the value of \$11,033,694 they gave employment to 1,868 persons, paid out in salaries and wages the sum of \$2,147,950 and expended \$7,279,923 for materials. Capital invested amounted to \$4,110,935.

The output of the awning, tent and sail industry was considerably higher in 1943. There were increases of \$2,476,863 or 28.9 per cent in the gross value of production, 65 in the number of persons employed, \$333,584 in the salaries and wages paid, \$682,262 in the value added by manufacture, and \$408,564 in the capital invested.

Ontario, with 33 establishments, accounted for 35 per cent of the total capital, 41 per cent of the employees and 33 per cent of the gross value of production. The 21 Quebec establishments reported 42 per cent of the capital invested, 39 per cent of the employment given and 47 per cent of the gross value of the output. The remainder of the establishments were located as follows: Nova Scotia 4, New Brunswick 1, Manitoba 4, Saskatchewan 3, Alberta 5, and British Columbia 6.

The principal items of production were: "tents, all kinds", the output of which was valued at \$1,002,234"covers, all kinds" valued at \$3,924,591, "bags all kinds" \$1,275,718, "awnings" \$476,055 and "flags, bunting and pennants \$552,273. The increased output of this industry amounting to .2,476,863 was mainly due to the demands of the armed forces of Canada. Indicative of this is the increase of \$165,580 in the value of flags, etc., \$375,363 in the value of :leeping bags and \$1,499,920 in the value of covers of all kinds manufactured in 1943.

July with 1,688 persons reported and January with 1,484 represented respectively the months of maximum and minimum employment of wage-carners.
