THE AWNING, TENT AND SAIL INDUSTRY

1952

Commencing with 1952 the value of factory shipments f.o.b. plant has been collected in place of gross value of production for the awning, tent and sail industry. This is in line with a decision taken by the Bureau to convert from a gross value of production to a gross value of shipments approach in its annual survey of manufacturing. The changeover is expected to provide increased ease in reporting for the majority of plants while at the same time producing more reliable, more meaningful statistics in many cases.

The value of shipments was substituted for value of production in all industries where inventory change was insignificant and where, therefore, factory shipments approximate production. The change in finished goods inventory in the awning, tent and sail industry during 1952 was only an estimated \$8,000. The value of factory shipments did, therefore, differ very little from value of production for the year under review and is comparable with value of production figures for previous years.

The activity of the awning, tent and sail industry in 1952 was practically the same as in 1951 despite the drop in establishments from 115 to 110. The factory shipments made by the industry had a value f.o.b. plant of \$11,281,927 which amount is slightly higher than the \$11,146,221 gross value of production reported in 1951. Employment was provided for 1,521 persons in 1952 compared with 1,547 in 1951 while payroll rose from \$2,785,670 to \$2,978,377 over the two years. Materials consumed cost \$6,210,356 in the latter year compared with \$6,627,662 in the earlier.

Establishments are to be found in all provinces with the exception of Prince Edward Island. Ontario was the dominant province with an industry comprised of 52 establishments which accounted for 49 per cent of employment and 45 per cent of shipments. The remaining establishments were located as follows: Newfoundland 3, Nova Scotia 4, New Brunswick 2, Quebec 24, Manitoba 6, Saskatchewan 3, Alberta 8 and British Columbia 8.

The most important single commodity in 1952 was tarpaulins, shipments of which were valued at \$2,415,916. Awnings ranked next to tarpaulins with shipments worth \$1,715,361. Tents which were shipped to the value of \$994,235 occupied third place followed by bags, all kinds, of which \$923,647 worth were shipped. Full details of products shipped will be found in Table 2 on page 5.

In 1952 the industry used 3,837,236 square yards of canvas and duck costing \$3,648,107 compared with 3,384,898 square yards costing \$3,404,095 in 1951. The utilization of awning fabric was also higher having increased over the two years from 682,935 square yards worth \$687,222 to 763,237 square yards worth \$738,910. Other materials are detailed in Table 3.

Tables 5 and 6 show the negligible effect of both exports and imports on the Canadian market for canvas products.
