

## THE AWNING, TENT AND SAIL INDUSTRY 1953

The goods shipped from the factories of Canadian awning, tent and sail manufacturers in 1953 had a value f.o.b. plant of \$12,392,074, an increase of 9.8 per cent over the preceding year's figure of \$11,281,927. The increase in production was slightly less. Allowing for an estimated decrease of \$188,000 in finished goods inventory during the year, the value of production in 1953 amounted to \$12,204,074 compared with \$11,257,927 in 1952, up 8.4 per cent.

Increased activity is indicated in other terms as well. Employment which stood at 1,521 in 1952 rose to 1,579 in 1953 accompanied by an increase in salary and wage payments from \$2,978,377 to \$3,322,604. Materials consumed in manufacture cost \$6,949,933 in the later year compared with \$6,210,356 in the earlier. Establishments numbered 116 in 1953 compared with 110 in 1952.

Establishments are to be found in all provinces with the exception of Prince Edward Island. Ontario was the dominant province with an industry comprised of 57 establishments which accounted for 49 per cent of employment and 54 per cent of shipments. The remaining establishments were located as follows: Newfoundland 3, Nova Scotia 4, New Brunswick 2, Quebec 25, Manitoba 6, Saskatchewan 3, Alberta 8 and British Columbia 8.

The most important single commodity in 1953 was tarpaulins, shipments of which were valued at \$2,550,511. Awnings ranked next to tarpaulins with shipments worth \$1,975,999. Tents which were shipped to the value of \$1,160,889 occupied third place followed by bags, all kinds, of which \$789,579 worth were shipped. Full details of products shipped will be found in Table 2 on page 5.

In 1953 the industry used 4,162,185 square yards of canvas and duck costing \$3,424,527 compared with 3,837,236 square yards costing \$3,648,109 in 1952. The utilization of awning fabric was also higher having increased over the two years from 763,237 square yards worth \$738,910 to 993,425 square yards worth \$1,026,597. Other materials are detailed in Table 3.

Tables 5 and 6 show the negligible effect of both exports and imports on the Canadian market for canvas products.
