

THE AWNING, TENT AND SAIL INDUSTRY

1954

The level of operations of the awning, tent and sail industry in 1954 was little different from a year earlier. Factory shipments in the year under review had a value f.o.b. plant of \$12,544,960 compared with the slightly lower figure of \$12,392,074 in 1953. The payroll listed 1,574 persons in 1954 and 1,579 persons in 1953 with salary and wage payments amounting to \$3,479,525 and \$3,322,604, respectively, in the two years. Materials cost \$6,676,118 in the later year, down somewhat from the \$6,949,933 cost of the earlier year. Establishments numbered 128 in 1954 as against 116 in 1953.

Establishments are to be found in all provinces with the exception of Prince Edward Island. Ontario was the dominant province with an industry comprised of 62 establishments which accounted for 44 per cent of employment and 43 per cent of shipments. The remaining establishments were located as follows: Newfoundland 3, Nova Scotia 4, New Brunswick 2, Quebec 29, Manitoba 7, Saskatchewan 3, Alberta 8 and British Columbia 10.

The most important single commodity in 1954 was tarpaulins, shipments of which were valued at \$2,326,834. Awnings ranked next to tarpaulins with shipments worth \$1,958,410. Tents which were shipped to the value of \$1,693,526 occupied third place followed by bags, all kinds, of which \$782,064 worth were shipped. Full details of products shipped will be found in Table 3 on page 5.

In 1954 the industry used 3,842,842 square yards of canvas and duck costing \$3,054,955 compared with 4,162,185 square yards costing \$3,424,527 in 1953. The utilization of awning fabric was also lower having decreased over the two years from 993,425 square yards worth \$1,026,597 to 887,502 square yards worth \$880,272. Other materials are detailed in Table 4.

Imports and exports of canvas products are both negligible, the former totalling \$103,106 and the latter \$4,248 in 1954.

Beginning with 1954 information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses is being collected as part of the annual Census of Industry. This data was formerly collected by a separate survey. The summarized results for the awning, tent and sail industry for the year under review will be found in Table 2.
