



THE AWNING, TENT AND SAIL INDUSTRY 1955

Activity in this industry in 1955 was higher than a year earlier. A total of \$13,998,095 was reported for factory shipments compared with \$12,544,960 in 1954, a rise of \$1,453,135 or 11.6 per cent. Employment rose from 1,574 to 1,722 and salaries and wages from \$3,479,525 to \$3,661,311. Materials used in manufacture cost \$7,256,353 in 1955 as against \$6,676,118 in 1954. Establishments numbered 139 in 1955 versus 128 in 1954.

Establishments are to be found in all provinces with the exception of Prince Edward Island. Ontario was the leading province having 65 establishments and accounting for 41.5 per cent of both employment and shipments. The remaining establishments were located as follows; Newfoundland 3, Nova Scotia 4, New Brunswick 2, Quebec 34, Manitoba 7, Saskatchewan 3, Alberta 10 and British Columbia 11.

The principal product of the industry is tarpaulins and in 1955 factory shipments were valued at \$3,043,797. Another leading commodity was tents with shipments worth \$2,067,856. Awnings which were shipped to the value of \$2,054,778 occupied third place followed by bags, all kinds, including sleeping, of which \$1,671,627 worth were shipped. Full details of products shipped will be found in Table 3 on page 5.

In 1955 the industry used 5,664,955 square yards of canvas and duck costing \$3,917,646 compared with 3,842,842 square yards costing \$3,054,955 in 1954. The consumption of awning fabric was also higher having risen over the two years from 887,502 square yards worth \$880,272 to 990,573 square yards worth \$968,631. Other materials are detailed in Table 4.

Imports and exports of canvas products are both negligible, the former totalling \$81,506 and the latter \$5,129 in 1955.

Beginning with 1954 information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses is being collected as part of the annual Census of Industry. This data was formerly collected by a separate survey. The summarized results for the Awning, Tent and Sail industry for the year under review will be found in Table 2.
