

THE AWNING, TENT AND SAIL INDUSTRY 1956

The goods shipped from the plants of Canadian awning, tent and sail manufacturers in 1956 had a value f.o.b. plant of \$15,931,995, an increase of 13.8 per cent over the preceding year's figure of \$13,998,095. The increase in production was slightly higher. Allowing for an increase of \$106,244 in finished goods inventory during the year, the value of production in 1956 amounted to \$16,050,128 compared with \$13,925,588 in 1955, up 15.2 per cent.

Increased activity is indicated in other terms as well. Employment which stood at 1,722 in 1955 rose to 1,787 in 1956, accompanied by an increase in salary and wage payments from \$3,661,311 to \$3,682,823. Materials consumed in manufacture cost \$9,574,039 in the later year compared with \$7,256,353 in the earlier. Establishments numbered 142 in 1956 as against 139 in 1955.

Establishments are to be found in all provinces except Prince Edward Island. Ontario and Quebec with a total of 100 establishments accounted for 77.5 per cent of employment and 77.3 per cent of shipments. The remaining establishments were located as follows: Newfoundland 2, Nova Scotia 5, New Brunswick 2, Manitoba 8, Saskatchewan 3, Alberta 9, and British Columbia 13.

The principal product of the industry is tarpaulins and in 1956 factory shipments were valued at \$3,661,016. Another leading commodity was tents with shipments worth \$2,711,654. Awnings which were shipped to the value of \$2,207,056 occupied third place followed by bags, all kinds, including sleeping, of which \$2,042,398 worth were shipped. Full details of products shipped will be found in Table 3 on page 5.

In 1956 the industry used 4,649,233 square yards of canvas and duck costing \$5,053,462 compared with 5,664,955 square yards costing \$3,917,646 in 1955. The consumption of awning fabric was reported at 1,103,189 square yards worth \$1,085,049 as against 990,573 square yards worth \$968,631 the year before. Other materials are detailed in Table 4.

Imports and exports of canvas products are both negligible, the former totalling \$80,214 and the latter \$5,168 in 1956.

Beginning with 1954 information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses is being collected as part of the Census of Industry. This data was formerly collected by a separate survey. The summarized results for the Awning, Tent and Sail industry for the year under review will be found in Table 2.

Note: Profits or losses cannot be estimated from Census figures as no data are collected for certain expense items, such as interest, rent, depreciation, taxes, insurance, advertising, etc.
