## THE COTTON AND JUTE BAG INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1933.

Reports were received from 21 establishments in 1935 whose principal output consisted of cotton and jute bags. This represented a decrease of 2 from the number reporting in the previous year.

Despite the reduction in the number of establishments reporting in 1933, however, the gross value of production advanced to \$7,481,842, an increase of \$500,654 or 2.8 per cent. The amount of capital invested in the industry, \$5,236,456, also increased by \$243,911 or 4.9 per cent. Employment was furnished to 902 persons, 17 more than in 1932, but their salary and wage bill, amounting to \$850,073, declined by \$21,185. The cost of all materials used was \$5,764,596, representing an increase of \$659,352 or 12.9 per cent, while the value added by manufacture, totalling \$1,717,246, declined by \$158,698 or 8.5 per cent. These variations in the principal statistics are shown by provinces in the following table, for 1933 in comparison with 1932.

The location of this industry by provinces is: Quebec 7, Ontario 8, Manitoba 5 and British Columbia 1. In order to avoid disclosing the operations of the establishment in British Columbia its figures have been merged with those of Manitoba. The percentage distribution of the principal statistics is shown in the following table, by provinces, for 1952 and 1953.

THE COTTON AND JUTE BAG INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1935.

The output of cotton and jute bags accounts for practically the whole production in this industry. In 1935 this value was \$7,308,818 or 97.7 per cent of the total value of production. The corresponding figures for 1932 were \$6,773,616 or 97.0 per cent of the total.

The materials used consisted principally of jute and cotton fabrics, and their consumption in 1935 was 89,995,968 yards valued at \$5,347,044 or 92.8 per cent of the total. In 1932 the amount was 88,676,292 yards costing \$4,809,125 or 94.2 per cent of the total.

By referring to table 6 it will be observed that in the case of production 9 establishments had an output valued at \$5,854,774 or 78.2 per cent of the total. 12 establishments supplied \$5,067,596 of the capital invested or 96.8 per cent of the total and 16 establishments furnished employment to 877 employees, representing 97.2 per cent of the total number employed.

The number of wage-earners showed an increase of 11 in 1935, the month of highest employment being November with 814 persons furnished employment, while January and February each with 723 persons were the months of minimum employment. In 1932 the corresponding months were November high with 839 and April low with 710.

Imports and exports are relatively unimportant in this industry. The value of the imports in 1935 was \$100,131 against a 1932 valuation of \$129,984. Exports in 1935 were valued at \$84,120 and in 1932 \$85,883.


