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

THE DYEING AND FINISHING OF TEXTILE GOODS IN CANADA, 1932.

Reports were received from nineteen establishments in 1932, whose principal occupation was the dyeing and finishing of textile fabrics, yarns, etc. Twelve of these establishments were located in Ontario and the remaining seven in Quebec.

They reported a gross value of work performed amounting to \$2,537,348 which was a decrease of \$355,985 or 12.3 per cent from the 1931 amount. The capital investment, \$4,688,350 in 1932, also showed a decrease of \$17,046 or .4 per cent. 762 persons were furnished employment, a decrease of eighty-five persons or ten per cent and their remuneration, amounting to \$804,100, also decreased by \$140,902 or 14.9 per cent in comparison with 1931. The cost of all materials used was \$619,662, \$134,984 or 17.9 per cent lower than in 1931, while the value added by manufacture dropped to \$1,917,686, a loss of \$221,001 or 10.4 per cent.

The following table illustrates, by provinces, the actual variations in 1932 in comparison with 1931.

The gross value of work performed in 1932 amounted to \$2,537,348 and of this amount the dyeing and finishing of textiles accounted for \$2,012,713 or over seventy-nine per cent of the total value. In 1931 the value was \$2,536,093 or over eighty-seven per cent. 20,449,200 yards were processed in 1932, however, in comparison with 17,989,971 yards in 1931, the average cost per yard being 9.8 cents in 1932 and 14.1 cents in 1931. In 1932 dyeing and finishing of yarms accounted for \$20,821, dyeing and finishing of hosiery, hat bodies, straw braids and other items cost \$88,872 and the cost of rubberizing, waterproofing and mercerizing of fabrics was valued at \$244,488. Shrinking of cloths accounted for \$62,252 in 1932 and \$66,977 in 1931.

Various chemicals and dyes constituted the principal materials used in this industry. They are shown in considerable detail in table 4 of this report,

The capital investment shows very little variation in this industry, there being a slight decline of \$17,046 in 1932 in comparison with 1931.

Employees, salaried and otherwise, showed a decline of eighty five in 1932 and their salaries and wages \$140,902. Employment was fairly steady throughout the year, the maximum month of employment being March with 699 persons and the minimum December with 602. In 1931 April was the maximum with 768 persons and December the minimum with 667.

The following tables illustrate the activities of this industry in detail.
