## DYEING AND FEVISHIVG OF TEXTLLE GOODS IN CANADA, 1945

In 1945 reports were received from forty estabilishments engaged in the dyeinc and finisting of textile goods. These include only those establishments whose occupation in primarily the dyeine and finisting of such goods, and do not incluce textile manufacturers who operate a dyedre and firishing plant or department in connection with their om manufacturing operations. Employment was furnished to 1,922 persons who were paid the sum of $92,923,684$ in salaries and mages. The eroas value of the work performed amountea to $\$ 8,331,308$ and the value adided by manufacture totalled $\$ 6,196,990$.

The incustry is confined to the provinces of Ontario and quebec. Ontario with sixteen establishments employed 933 persons, while Quebec with twenty-four establishments reported 989 persons. Guebec with over 51 per cent of the employee: and about 50 per cent of the value of procuction se the rost important contre of the industry.

Ehiss industry operated at a subetantially hicher level of production Gurine 1945 which is reflected in an increase of 255 in the rumber of persons erployed and $\$ 407,672$ in the salaries and woees mid. There was al.so an increase of $\$ 1,379,961$ or 29.8 per cent in the value of work performed.

The gross value of the work perforred in 1945 anounted to $\$ 8,331,208$ of whick $55,485,574$ or approximately 66 per cent, was represented by the dyeing and finishing of textile fabrics. The dyeing and finishing of jams amounted to $\$ 936,-$ 786 or 11 per cent, while the printing and painting of fabrics and all other work totalled \$1,910,948. The various items are shown in detail in table 3.
hs indicated in talle 8 , there is little or no seasonal variation in employment in this industry. The great majority of the ragemearners are male, and numbered 1,133 , or 70 per cent of the total wage earners in 1945 while the female wage-earners totalled 47 。. The average annual wage was $\$ 1,249$ compared to $\$ 1,251$ in 1944 while the average salary rose from $\$ 2,716$ in that year to $\$ 2,745$ in 1946 .

The value of materials purchased on own account was eliminated from both the value of materials used as well as the products made, the amount recelved for processing such materials only being comsidored as the value of products mado.
