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

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

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THE SILK INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1931.

The silk industry in Canada is divided into two distinct branches, real silk and artificial silk. However due to the fact that the manufacture of artificial silk is largely concentrated in two establishments, the figures for both branches of the industry are combined, in order to avoid the disclosure of individual operations. The industry is located entirely in the provinces of Quebec and Ontario. Twenty-three establishments were in operation in 1931, a decrease of two from the preceding year, thirteen of them being located in Quebec and ten in Ontario.

The year 1931 saw a further expansion in this industry, despite a reduction of two in the number of establishments operating. The value of production, amount of capital invested, number of employees, amount of salaries and wages, and the value added by manufacture all showed increases in comparison with 1930, which in turn had shown a large increase in both volume and value in every phase compared with 1929.

The remarkable progress made by this industry since 1917 is summarized in table 2. In this period the value of production increased over 666 per cent; capital invested 1,348 per cent; number of employees 661 per cent and the salaries and wages paid them by 1,367 per cent.

In 1931 the value of production amounted to \$18,187,492 an increase of \$378,894 or 2.1 per cent over 1930. The principal item of production was broad silk or piece goods of real silk of which 8,657,612 yards were produced valued at \$6,469,207. In comparison with 1930 this was an increase of 2,529,934 yards and \$160,348 in value. Piece goods of artificial silk measured 4,073,434 yards valued at \$2,323,662. Real silk mixtures 2,869,866 yards worth \$2,367,112, 4,383,833 pounds of silk, artificial silk, yarns and threads and their mixtures valued at \$4,055,203 were also produced. This was an increase of 701,740 pounds and \$201,844 in comparison with 1930.

Capital investment consisting of lands, buildings, fixtures, machinery, tools, equipment, materials, stocks of merchandise, cash, bills and accounts receivable, etc., amounted to \$32,205,207 in 1931, an increase of \$1,699,147 or 5.5 per cent over 1930. The number of employees, salaried and otherwise was 6,273 or 880 more than were furnished employment in 1930. They were paid \$6,758,995 in salaries and wages, an increase of \$1,040,405 over the previous year.

The cost of raw materials was the only item to show a decline in 1931, when their value was \$6,482,197, a decline of \$1,151,132 compared with 1930, and although the value decreased, the volume increased. Raw silk is accountable for the difference. In 1931, of this commodity there was purchased 1,229,482 pounds, an increase of 145,040 pounds, but the 1931 value was \$3,243,723 or \$1,304,765 less than

the corresponding value in 1930. The value added by manufacture in 1931 was \$11,705,295 or \$1,530,026 greater than in 1930.

Imports and exports showed a decided decrease in 1931. The imports of real silk and manufactures amounted to \$14,411,551, and of artificial silk and manufactures \$6,023,421, a total of \$20,434,972. In 1930 corresponding figures were: real silk and manufactures \$21,000,571, artificial silk and manufactures \$13,780,922. Total \$34,781,493. The decline in 1931 is therefore \$14,346,521. Exports in 1931 amounted to \$269,781, a decrease of \$81,331 from the 1930 figure of \$351,112.

THE SILK INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1931.Size of Establishments

In view of the tendency towards concentration in industrial enterprises a series of tables has been prepared presenting in a threefold way the size of establishments in the Silk Industry in 1931 measured by (a) capital investment, (b) gross value of production and (c) employment. These tables when compared for a term of years indicate the movement of capital, production and employment within the industry.

Several changes took place in the industry in this year. The average capital investment increased from \$1,220,242 in 1930 to \$1,400,226 in 1931. In gross value of products, the average per establishment shows an increase from \$712,344 in 1930 to \$790,761 in 1931, while the average number of employees per plant also rose from 216 in 1930 to 273 in 1931. These tables also indicate the degree of large scale production which obtains in this industry. Seven of the largest mills for example, had an output valued at \$14,289,753 or 78.5 per cent of the total.
