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THE WOOLLEN TEXTILE INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1932.

This industry is divided into four sections — (1) woollen cloth, (2) woollen yarns, (3) carpets, mats and rugs, and (4) woollen goods, n. e. s. which comprises all manufactured articles, the chief component of which is wool and which cannot be properly classified under sections 1, 2 and 3.

The number of establishments to report their operations in 1932 was 130, an increase of four over the preceding year. The provincial distribution of these establishments is shown by industries in table 1 of this report.

With the exception of the number of employees engaged in this industry, every phase of manufacturing operations showed a decline in 1932 in comparison with 1931. Employment was furnished to 8,536 persons in 1932, an increase of 378 or 4.7 per cent over 1931. The gross value of production of the four sections was \$23,301,015, a decrease of \$2,155,022 or 8.5 per cent. The amount of capital investment, \$42,539,722, dropped \$546,952 or 1.3 per cent. Salaries and wages paid totalled \$7,121,340, \$304,295 or 4.1 per cent less than in 1931. The cost of all materials used was \$10,776,770, a decrease of \$715,157 or 6.2 per cent, while the value added by manufacture, \$12,524,245, declined by \$1,439,865 or 10.3 per cent. These variations in 1932 as compared with 1931 are shown in the following table by the different industries.

From the foregoing table it will be observed that practically all the loss occurred in the carpets, mats and rugs and woollen goods, n.e.s. industries. Weellen cloth and yarns not only held their own but made some small gains over their 1931 operations.

The following table shows the percentage distribution of the principal statistics of the woollen textile group, by provinces, and it will be noted that the greater proportion of the industry is located in the province of Ontario.

In order that production and materials used might be shown in as great detail as possible, combined tables covering both of these items have been compiled for the four sections. With the exception of woollen cloths, no other detailed tables of products or materials used is shown in the report.

The combined gross value of production in 1932 totalled \$23,301,015 against a value of \$25,456,037 in 1931. The various items comprising these totals are shown in detail in table 4.

The cost of all materials used in 1932 was \$10,776,770 against a corresponding value of \$11,491,927 in 1931 and the individual items are shown in table 5 for both years.

Imports of wool and its manufactures declined from \$20,261,011 in 1931 to \$16,213,759 in 1932. The principal source of supply was the United Kingdom from which our purchases were valued at \$15,193,497 in 1931 and \$12,990,565 in 1932.

Exports were relatively small, amounting to only \$872,403 in 1932 against a value of \$1,271,811 in 1931. The principal items of export were greasy wool and felt manufactures which together accounted for \$761,414 in 1932 and \$1,071,795 in 1931.

SECTION 1. - THE WOOLLEN CLOTH INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1932.

With the exception of the amount of capital investment and the number of salaried employees, the woollen cloth industry showed small increases in its other manufacturing operations in 1932 in comparison with 1931.

Reports were received from fifty-five establishments in 1932, an increase of one over 1931. They reported a gross value of production of \$13,127,796, an increase of \$22,263 over the 1931 production. The cost of raw and other materials used was \$6,311,800, also an increase of \$92,414. The value added by manufacture, however, declined from \$6,886,147 in 1931 to \$6,815,996 in 1932, being \$70,151 less than the previous year.

In 1932, the amount of capital invested in this industry was \$21,105,744, a decline of \$921,312 from the investment in 1931. Employment was furnished to 4,990 persons, both salaried and wage earning, representing an increase of 413 persons over 1931. The amount of salaries and wages paid fell from \$4,180,444 in 1931 to \$4,165,731 in 1932, a decrease of \$14,713 in the latter year.

These variations in the principal statistics are shown by provinces in the following table for 1932 in comparison with 1931.

It can be noted from the foregoing table that Ontario showed a slight recession in manufacturing in 1932, the gains being made by Quebec and the other provinces.

While the actual value of production, \$13,127,796, showed a small increase in 1932, the increase in the physical volume, due to the lower prevailing prices, was quite substantial. The most important items of production in this industry in both 1931 and 1932 were fabrics, all wool, woollen and all wool worsted. Of the former, 4.924.547 yards were produced in 1932 valued at \$4.780,076 or an average price of ninety seven cents per yard. The production in 1931 of this item was 3,210,218 yards worth \$3,954,864, or an average of \$1.23 per yard. Of all wool worsted, the output in 1932 was 2,544,737 yards worth \$3,575,186, an average of \$1 40 per yard, while the corresponding figures for 1931 were 2,135,788 yards with a value of \$3,623,139, or an average price per yard of \$1.69. The value of these two items totalled \$8,355,262 in 1932, 63.6 per cent of the total value of production, while in 1931 their total was \$7,578,003 or 57.8 per cent. The output of velour, plush and mohair fabrics declined from 980,532 yards valued at \$1,588,012 in 1931 to 818,861 yards worth \$1,018,439 in 1932. Other important items of production in 1932 were wool blankets 66,023 pairs worth \$245,686; slumber throws 31,694 valued at \$101,759; auto cloths 276,458 yards valued at \$431,535; woollen and worsted yarns 1,353,100 pounds worth \$700,003.

The principal material used in 1931 and 1932 by this industry was worsted yarn. The consumption in 1932 amounted to 2,261,754 pounds worth \$1,773,192. In 1931 this consumption was 2,099,607 pounds costing \$1,731,347. In 1932 all other yarns, including mohair, cotton, silk, etc., totalled 1,812,811 pounds worth \$750,365 and the corresponding figures in 1931 were 1,761,835 pounds and \$755,110. The consumption of domestic raw wool in 1932 was 4,287,769 pounds worth \$585,313 and in 1931, 2,944,985 pounds worth \$519,414. Imported wool consumed in 1932 was 4,456,849 pounds costing \$1,095,480 against a consumption of 4,352,438 pounds valued at \$1,252,269 in 1931. Noils and tops of wool accounted for \$517,282 in 1932 and \$702,537 in 1931. The consumption of dyestuffs, chemicals, etc., was \$514,440 in 1932 and \$528,248 in 1931. All materials used are shown in detail for 1931 and 1932 in table 13.

The capital invested in the industry in 1932 amounted to \$21,105,744. This represented a decline of \$921.312 which was fully accounted for in the materials and stocks on hand, fuel, miscellaneous supplies, etc.

By referring to table 15, it will be noted that the bulk of the manufacturing is performed by less than half the establishments reporting. In the case of production, twenty one establishments accounted for \$11,475,634 or 87.4 per cent of the total value of production, twenty four establishments supplied \$19,487,550 or 92.3 per cent of the total capital investment, while twenty four establishments furnished employment to 4,500 persons, 90 2 per cent of the total employed.

The average number of wage earners showed an increase in 1932 over 1931. The month of highest employment in the former year was November with 4,803 and the lowest was January with 4,304. Corresponding figures for 1931 were December high with 4,358 and January low with 3,875.

SECTION 2 THE WOOLLEN YARN INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1932.

The woollen yarn industry was one of the bright spots in the woollen textile group in 1932. Despite lower prices prevailing in that year, the industry showed increases in every phase of its manufacturing operations, except in the value added by manufacture which declined from \$2,338,104 in 1931 to \$2,181,583 in 1932, a decrease of \$156,521 or 6.7 per cent.

In 1932, twenty nine establishments reported a gross value of production of \$4,593,019, an increase of \$45,270 or one per cent. The amount of capital investment advanced to \$7,706,249, an increase of \$1,424,284 or 22.7 per cent. Employment was furnished to 1,755 persons, an increase of 205 or 13.2 per cent. The amount of salaries and wages paid them was \$1,210,169, a gain of \$87,577 or 7.9 per cent, and the cost of all materials used advanced to \$2,411,436, an increase over the 1931 figures of \$201,791 or 9.1 per cent.

The following table shows the variations in the principal statistics, by provinces, in 1932 in comparison with 1931, and it will be noted that Ontario supplied most of the gains made.

The two principal items of production in this industry are worsted and woollen yarns. In 1932, of the former, 4,019,814 pounds were produced valued at \$3,190,963, an average price per pound of seventy-nine cents. This production in 1931 was 3,233,665 pounds worth \$2,910,029, an average price of ninety cents per pound. Woollen yarns to the extent of 2,892,791 pounds were produced in 1932 worth \$833,728, an average price of twenty-nine cents per pound against a 1931 output of 2,532,251 pounds valued at \$900,099 or an average of thirty-six cents per pound.

These two items are the only important ones in this industry for which figures can be shown without disclosing the operations of individual establishments.

Tops of wool is the most important material used in this industry. In 1932, 4,097,528 pounds costing \$1,462,745 were used, and the 1931 consumption was 3,299,017 pounds costing \$1,231,599. The yarns consumed, including worsted, woollen, merino, cotton, artificial silk, etc., were 777,718 pounds worth \$324,024 in 1932 and 846,008 pounds costing \$378,702 in 1931. Consumption of raw wool, both domestic and imported, was 859,603 pounds worth \$150,859 in 1932 and in 1931 it was 749,590 pounds costing \$161,855.

The capital investment, both fixed and working, showed an increase in 1932. In fixed capital the increase was \$863,374 and in working capital \$560,910.

The bulk of the manufacturing is concentrated in less than a dozen establishments in this industry. By referring to table 25, it will be noted that ten establishments accounted for \$4,466,528 or 97.3 per cent of the total output, eleven establishments supplied \$7,545,417 or 97.9 per cent of the total capital investment and ten establishments furnished employment to 1,675 persons or 95.4 per cent of the total number employed.

The average number of wage-earners showed an increase of 192 or 13.2 per cent in 1932. November with 1,845 employees was the month of highest employment and August with 1,494 was the lowest. The corresponding figures for 1931 were October high with 1,514 and January low with 1,334.

In the carpet, mat and rug industry, twenty-two establishments reported their operations for 1932, this being an increase of one over the preceding year. There was a considerable recession of activity in this industry in 1932, however, the twenty-two establishments reporting a gross value of production of \$2,109,326, a decrease of \$1,409,185 or 40.1 per cent.

All other principal statistics of this industry showed decreases in 1932 which are summarized as follows: capital investment \$6,692,909, a decrease of \$552,505 or 7.6 per cent. Employment was furnished to 946 persons, 174 or 15.5 per cent fewer than in 1931. They were paid \$858,264 in salaries and wages, which represented a drop of \$333,201 or 27.9 per cent. The cost of materials used was \$774,857, being \$553,563 or 41.6 per cent lower than the 1931 cost, and the value added by manufacture, \$1,334,469, declined by \$855,622 or 39.1 per cent.

It is impossible to show more than a few items of production in this industry without disclosing the figures of individual establishments, and the same condition prevails with regard to materials. Carpets and floor coverings are, of course, the

principal articles produced and they are listed in detail in table 4 on pages 4, 5 and 6.

The principal materials used consisted of yarns, worsted, woollen, coir, cotton, jute, hemp, linen, artificial silk and others, totalling 3,089,187 pounds and costing \$676,611. The corresponding amounts in 1931 were 4,553,696 pounds costing \$1,193,734. These figures represented eighty-seven and eighty-nine per cent of the cost of all materials used in 1932 and 1931 respectively.

The average number of wage-earners employed in 1932 decreased by 151 persons. The month of highest employment was January with 865 persons employed, while August with only 527 was the lowest. In 1931, December was the highest with 1,017, January having 960, and September with 812 was the lowest.

This section of the woollen industry includes all manufactured articles, the chief component material of which is wool, and which cannot properly be classified under the other sections. The principal articles manufactured in 1932 were woollen fabrics, blankets and slumber throws, felt goods, shoddy, mungo and wool extract, pulled wool, pickled skins and rags and wipers.

Twenty-four establishments reported their operations in 1932, an increase of one over the preceding year. They reported a gross value of production of \$3,470,870, a decrease of \$813,370 or nineteen per cent from 1931. The capital investment, \$7,034,820, also declined by \$497,419 or 6.6 per cent. Employment was furnished to 895 persons, sixty-six less than in 1931, and the amount of salaries and wages paid them, \$887,176, also declined by \$43,958 or 4.7 per cent. The cost of all materials used was \$1,278,677, a decrease of \$455,799 or 26.7 per cent over the 1931 cost, while the value added by manufacture, \$2,192,197, declined by \$357,571 or fourteen per cent.

These actual variations in the principal statistics in 1932 as compared with 1931 are shown in the following table.

Very few items of production can be shown separately in this industry without publishing statistics of less than three establishments. The principal one in 1932 was paper makers' felts of wool and cotton with an output of 1,649,422 pounds worth \$1,871,442 as against 1,705,414 pounds valued at \$2,084,140 in 1931. Shoe felts to the

amount of 255,168 yards and valued at \$156,559 were produced in 1932, the same production in 1931 being 306,901 yards worth \$157,027. The value of the output of wool blankets and slumber throws was \$345,583 in 1932 and \$399,918 in 1931. Other items of production were: shoddy, mungo and wool extract 2,384,065 pounds worth \$217,255 in 1932 and 3,487,887 pounds worth \$384,660 in 1931; pulled wool 1,452,966 pounds valued at \$189,443 in 1932 and pickled skins 29,425 dozen worth \$72,863 in 1932 against 31,099 dozen worth \$80,121 in 1931.

Raw wool, domestic and imported, accounted for the bulk of the materials used in this industry. In 1932 the consumption was 2,522,046 pounds costing \$503,015. The figures for 1931 were 2,696,142 pounds costing \$634,216. Rags, clippings, etc., were consumed to the extent of 4,457,515 pounds costing \$137,455 in 1932 and 3,494,220 pounds worth \$143,102 in 1931. Wool stock, wool waste and shoddy accounted for 915,070 pounds at a cost of \$71,768 in 1932 against 984,339 pounds costing \$91,693 in 1931. 385,840 sheep skins valued at \$185,195 were used in 1932 in comparison with 377,758 valued at \$161,558 in 1931. All materials used in the woollen textile group of industries are included in detail in table 5 of this report on pages 6, 7 and 8.

By referring to table 44, it will be noted that six establishments accounted for \$2,834,330 or 81.6 per cent of the total value of production, seven establishments supplied \$6,334,259 or ninety per cent of the capital invested in the industry and ten establishments furnished employment to 804 persons or 89.8 per cent of the total number employed.

In 1932 the number of wage-earners employed in this industry fell off by sixty-seven from the previous year. The month of maximum employment was March with 814 persons and August with 767 was the minimum. In 1931 April was the maximum with 915 and January the minimum with 818.




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
