

# THE MISCELLANEOUS TEXTILES INDUSTRIES

1949

This Report is in two sections, the first covering the Oilcloth, Linoleum and Coated Fabrics industry and the second the new Miscellaneous Textiles which is a residual grouping bringing together widely scattered segments of textile enterprise into what is believed to be a more logical and useful compilation. These changes are in accord with the new Standard Industrial Classification adopted in 1949.

There is no break in the continuity of the Oilcloth, Linoleum and Coated Fabrics Industry because formerly this was the group known as the

Miscellaneous Textiles Industry and comparable statistics for this industry are presented back to 1938.

The new miscellaneous grouping will be found in three sections: II A covering Embroidery, Pleating Hemstitching, Etc., formerly classified with Women's Factory Clothing; II B covering Fabric Auto Accessories; formerly classified under Miscellaneous Industries; and II C covering Miscellaneous Textiles, n.e.s., which is made up almost entirely of firms formerly classified under Miscellaneous Cotton Goods and Cotton and Wool Waste.

## SECTION I. OILCLOTH, LINOLEUM AND COATED FABRICS, 1949

The activity of the oilcloth, linoleum and coated fabrics industry in 1949 was at a slightly higher level than in the previous year. Production was up by 4.6 per cent from \$26,935,881 in 1948 to \$28,170,145 in 1949. The cost of materials used was up by \$271,949 from \$15,385,706 in 1948 to \$15,657,655 the following year. Employees were up from 2,016 in 1948 to 2,309 in 1949 and salaries and wages were up by 23 per cent, from \$4,929,326 in 1948 to \$6,053,518 the following year.

The industry in 1949 consisted of 14 establishments of which 7 were in Quebec, 4 in Ontario and 3 in British Columbia. Quebec accounted for 72 per cent of the total production and 75 per cent of the employment of the industry.

The chief items of production consisted of linoleum and felt based floor coverings, pyroxylin coated fabrics, window blinds, oilcloth and saturated felt. However no detailed breakdown of the products of this industry can be given because individual company information would be revealed.

There was an increase in both quantity and value of linoleum and felt based floor coverings. On the other hand both pyroxylin coated and synthetic resin coated fabrics decreased in quantity and value. Window and slatted blinds showed an increase from \$2,865,146 in 1948 to \$3,018,269 in 1949. Other products included curtains, film, house furnishing hardware, adhesives and electrical insulating material.

Exports of oilcloth and linoleum showed a very large decline. Exports of oilcloth or linoleum, as used for covering floors declined from 1,079,148 square yards in 1948 valued at \$511,957 to 207,081 square yards valued at \$94,470 in 1949. Oilcloth, n.o.p., declined from 479,069 square yards valued at \$199,013 to 54,066 square yards valued at \$17,318. Imports of oilcloth, floor linoleum, cork matting or carpets declined from 26,575,159 pounds worth \$5,506,974 in 1948 to 18,486,862 pounds valued at \$3,565,823 in 1949. Imports of oilcloth, enamelled, carriage, shelf and table also showed a decline from 584,075 pounds valued at \$425,421 to 297,930 pounds valued at \$251,159 in 1949.

## SECTION II A. EMBROIDERY, PLEATING, HEMSTITCHING, ETC., 1949

The new Standard Industrial Classification adopted in 1949 reclassifies embroidery, pleating, hemstitching, etc. from women's factory clothing to miscellaneous textiles.

In terms of production and employment the activity of the group of firms included under embroidery, pleating, hemstitching, etc. was at a higher level in 1949 than in the previous year. Production was up by \$227,413, from \$6,682,702 in 1948 to \$6,910,115 in 1949, a gain of 3.4 per cent. Employment was up by 38, from 1,673 in 1948 to 1,711 in 1949, a rise of 2.3 per cent and salaries and wages were up by 5.3 per cent from \$2,755,325 in 1948 to \$2,902,264 in 1949. The cost of materials, however, showed a slight decline from \$2,054,582 in 1948 to \$2,011,338 in 1949.

The industry in 1949 consisted of 129 establishments of which 90 were in Quebec, 34 in Ontario, 2 in Manitoba, 1 in Alberta and 2 in British Columbia. Montreal accounted for 71 per cent of the gross value of production of the industry and

75 per cent of the employment. Toronto was responsible for 26 per cent of the production and 21 per cent of employment.

Of a total value of production of \$6,910,115, 81 per cent or \$5,570,882 was made up of embroidery, bindings, pleating, hemstitching, button covering and buttonholes. Embroidery accounted for \$3,135,004 and cotton bindings \$1,112,791. There is no detailed breakdown of the materials used in this industry.

Employment was fairly stable, the monthly employment of wage-earners varying from a high of 1450 in September to a low of 1274 in December. There was a large proportion of female labour in this industry. In Quebec for example there were 669 female wage-earners compared with 384 male wage-earners and in Ontario there were 183 female wage-earners compared with 118 male. For Canada as a whole female wage-earners in this industry accounted for almost 64 per cent of all wage-earners.

## SECTION II B. FABRIC AUTO ACCESSORIES, 1949

In the new Standard Industrial Classification adopted in 1949, the fabric auto accessories industry is included with miscellaneous textiles instead of miscellaneous industries.

In 1949 there were 8 establishments in the fabric auto accessories industry compared with 9 the previous year. Employment and value of output were increased but there was a drop in the physical volume of seat covers at the same time as their value rose. The industry was largely concentrated in Ontario and this province accounted for 85 per cent of total production.

The value of output of the industry of \$6,362,064 in 1949 compared with \$5,615,785 the previous year and represented a gain of 13 per cent. Cost of materials used was up from \$2,903,188 in 1948 to \$3,189,372 in 1949, a gain of 10 per cent. Em-

ployment in 1949 was 827 compared with 753 the previous year.

Products of this industry included such items as trim sets, glass run channel, seat and radiator covers, fender welts, metal stampings, etc., but as they are largely the production of less than three firms they cannot be fully specified. Seat covers were valued at \$1,463,034, radiator and other covers at \$35,608 and all other accessories at \$4,582,809.

Materials used consisted of such items as fabrics, cardboard foundations, metals, windowcord, artificial leather, etc., but many of these cannot be separately specified. Upholstering materials were valued at \$28,154, other fabrics including rubberized at \$921,095 and artificial leather at \$158,147.

## SECTION II C. MISCELLANEOUS TEXTILE GOODS, N. E. S., 1949

The residual industrial grouping known as miscellaneous textile goods, n.e.s., which was set up in 1949, includes those firms which could not be categorized under more specific sections of the standard industrial classification. Most of the firms in this industry were previously to be found under miscellaneous cotton goods and cotton and wool waste.

This group of firms in 1949 produced goods valued at \$26,469,346 and gave employment to 3,012 persons who were paid in salaries and wages the sum of \$5,361,554. Materials used were valued

at \$15,817,146. Of the 135 establishments in this industry, 75 were in Quebec and 51 in Ontario. Quebec accounted for 60 per cent of production, or \$15,815,109 and 60 per cent of salaries and wages.

Chief items of production consisted of medical and sanitary supplies valued at \$8,217,009, wipers and rags valued at \$2,667,516, cotton curtains worth \$1,916,334 and cotton bedspreads worth \$1,860,158. The chief material consumed was cotton fabrics, involving, in 1949, 12,651,460 linear yards valued at \$4,102,175.


