

THE MISCELLANEOUS TEXTILES INDUSTRIES, 1951

This Report is in two sections, the first covering the Oilcloth, Linoleum and Coated Fabrics Industry and the second the new Miscellaneous Textiles which is a residual grouping bringing together widely scattered segments of textile enterprise into what is believed to be a more logical and useful compilation. These changes are in accord with the new Standard Industrial Classification adopted in 1949.

There is no break in the continuity of the Oilcloth, Linoleum and Coated Fabrics Industry because

formerly this was the group known as the Miscellaneous Textiles Industry and comparable statistics for this industry are presented back to 1938.

The new miscellaneous grouping will be found in three sections: II A covering Embroidery, Pleating, Hemstitching, Etc., formerly classified with Women's Factory Clothing; II B covering Fabric Auto Accessories; formerly classified under Miscellaneous Industries; and II C covering Miscellaneous Textiles, n.e.s., which is made up almost entirely of firms formerly classified under Miscellaneous Cotton Goods and Cotton and Wool Waste.

SECTION I. OILCLOTH, LINOLEUM AND COATED FABRICS, 1951

The oilcloth, linoleum and coated fabric industry in 1951 operated at a lower level of production because of a slightly smaller output of floor coverings and table linoleum. There were moderate increases in employment, salaries and wages as well as in the cost of materials used. In 1951 there were 15 establishments in the industry of which 8 were in Quebec, 4 in Ontario and 3 in British Columbia. Quebec accounted for 72 per cent of the total production and 76 per cent of the employment of the industry.

Production by the industry at \$29,381,734 in 1951 was \$902,114 or 3 per cent lower than the \$30,283,848 reported in 1950. The cost of materials rose slightly from \$16,618,156 in 1950 to \$16,727,708 in 1951, an increase of \$109,552. Employment was up from 2,351 in 1950 to 2,379 in the year under review while salaries and wages rose from \$6,638,152 to \$7,131,411.

The chief items of production consisted of linoleum and felt based floor coverings, pyroxylin coated fabrics, window blinds, oilcloth and saturated felt. However no detailed breakdown of the products of this industry can be given because

individual company information would be revealed. There was a decrease in the volume of production of both linoleum floor coverings and felt based floor coverings as well as in table oil cloth. Window and slatted blinds decreased from \$2,796,952 in 1950 to \$2,570,799 in 1951. Of the materials used, fabrics were valued at \$4,020,263 in 1951 compared with \$4,127,509 in 1950. Felt was consumed to the extent of \$2,841,219 in 1951 compared with \$2,751,543 the previous year. There was an increase in the value of linseed oil consumed from \$3,045,458 in 1950 to \$3,233,190 in 1951.

Exports of oilcloth or linoleum, as used for covering floors, declined from 42,624 square yards valued at \$24,825 in 1950 to 32,155 square yards valued at \$13,731 in 1951. However, exports of oilcloth, n.o.p. rose from 28,629 square yards valued at \$8,228 in 1950 to 40,518 square yards valued at \$13,214 in 1951. Imports of oilcloth, floor linoleum, cork matting or carpets amounted to 23,030,142 pounds valued at \$3,488,996 in 1951 compared with 20,225,495 pounds valued at \$3,191,572 in 1950. Imports of oilcloth, enamelled, carriage, shelf and table, increased from 576,826 pounds worth \$458,033 in 1950 to 812,930 pounds worth \$669,682 in 1951.

SECTION II A. EMBROIDERY, PLEATING, HEMSTITCHING, ETC., 1951

In this industry in 1951 there were three additional establishments and production and employment showed increases. Of a total of 131 establishments, 92 were in Quebec, 35 in Ontario, 2 in Manitoba and 2 in British Columbia. Montreal accounted for 69 per cent of the gross value of production and 75 per cent of the employment of the industry. Toronto was responsible for 28 per cent of the production and 21 per cent of employment.

The industry's production at \$8,021,248 in 1951 was \$719,031 or 10 per cent in excess of the \$7,302,217 reported in 1950. Employment increased from 1,639 to 1,664 over the two years and salaries and wages rose from \$2,914,698 to \$3,054,933. The

cost of materials was up by 15 per cent or \$357,829 from \$2,337,271 in 1950 to \$2,694,900 in 1951.

Of the total value of production, 64 per cent or \$5,160,430 was made up of embroidery, bindings, pleating, hemstitching, button covering and button-holes. Embroidery accounted for \$3,202,286 and cotton bindings for \$429,696. There is no detailed breakdown of the materials used in this industry.

The monthly employment of wage-earners varied from a high of 1,437 in March to a low of 1,287 in December. There is a large proportion of female wage-earners in the industry, amounting in 1951 to 63 per cent of all wage-earners.

SECTION II.B. FABRIC AUTO ACCESSORIES, 1951

In 1951 in the fabric auto accessories industry there was slightly lower employment but the gross value of production and the value of materials used were at higher levels. The industry in 1951 consisted of 9 establishments of which 5 were in Ontario, 2 in Quebec and 2 in Manitoba. Ontario accounted for 82 per cent of the industry's production and 82 per cent of employment.

The 1951 value of output of the industry at \$6,843,973 exceeded the 1950 total of \$6,451,047 by \$392,926 or 6 per cent. Employment declined by 32 from 726 in 1950 to 694 in 1951. Salaries and wages increased from \$1,681,547 in 1950 to \$1,737,883 in the year under review. The cost of materials rose from \$3,172,158 to \$3,478,348 over the same period.

Products of this industry included such items as trim sets, glass run channel, seat and radiator covers, fender welts, metal stampings, etc., but as they are largely the production of less than three firms they cannot be fully specified. In 1951 seat covers were valued at \$1,531,991 while radiator and other covers were produced to the extent of \$60,950.

Materials used consisted of such items as fabrics, cardboard foundations, metals, windowcord, artificial leather, etc., but many of these cannot be separately specified. Upholstering materials, rubberized fabrics and other fabrics were used to the extent of \$1,145,703 in 1951 compared with \$1,185,382 in 1950.

SECTION IIIC. MISCELLANEOUS TEXTILE GOODS N.E.S., 1951

Production of the residual textile grouping rose from \$30,901,588 in 1950 to \$35,555,916 in 1951, a gain of \$4,654,328 or 15 per cent. However the chief items of production, medical and sanitary products, fell from \$10,008,160 in 1950 to \$9,853,576 in the year under review. Of the 151 establishments in the industry in 1951, 75 were in Quebec and 61 in Ontario. In addition there were 7 establishments in Manitoba, 5 in British Columbia and 1 each in Alberta, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island.

The increase in the value of production was accompanied by an increase in the cost of materials from \$18,894,697 in 1950 to \$21,524,966 in 1951. Employment was up from 3,287 in 1950 to 3,434 in 1951 and salaries and wages increased from \$6,102,347 to \$6,649,961. The monthly employment

of wage-earners varied from a high of 2,775 in April to a low of 2,511 in December.

In addition to medical and sanitary products there were a number of other chief products in the industry. Wipers and rags advanced from \$3,058,430 in 1950 to \$3,529,037 in 1951. There was a decline, however in cotton curtains from \$1,629,159 to \$1,434,231 in the same period and the output of cotton bedspreads showed a reduction from \$1,974,545 in 1950 to \$1,650,081 in 1951.

The chief material consumed by this industry was cotton fabrics which showed an increase from 11,750,710 linear yards valued at \$4,588,869 in 1950 to 13,421,074 linear yards worth \$5,031,754 in 1951. For full details of production and materials used reference should be made to tables 2 and 3.
