THE MISCELLANEOUS TEXTILE INDUSTRIES

1953

This report consists of two sections, the first covering the oilcloth, linoleum and coated fabrics industry and the second a group of three industries which together comprise the miscellaneous textile goods industry of the Standard Industrial Classifi-

cation adopted in 1949. The three components of the miscellaneous textile goods industry are embroidery, pleating, hemstitching, etc., fabric auto accessories and miscellaneous textiles, n.e.s. They will be found in Sections 11A, 11B and 11C, respectively.

SECTION I. OILCLOTH, LINOLEUM AND COATED FABRICS, 1953

Goods having a value f.o.b. plant of \$30,833,083 were shipped from the factories of the oilcloth, linoleum and coated fabrics industry in 1953. This compares with the 1952 figure of \$30,545,392 and represents a slight increase. Employment which stood at 2,402 in 1952 fell to 2,236 in 1953 while salaries and wages advanced from \$7,349,657 to \$7,470,347 over the two years. The cost of materials used decreased from \$15,827,257 in 1952 to \$15,219,537 in 1953.

There were 15 establishments in the industry in 1953, one more than in 1952. Nine of these were located in Quebec, 3 in Ontario and 3 in British Columbia. Quebec dominated the industry by accounting for 72 per cent of total shipments and 80 per cent of all persons employed.

The leading products of the industry were linoleum and felt based floor coverings, pyroxylin and synthetic resin coated fabrics, window blinds, table oilcloth and saturated felt. However, no detailed breakdown of the products of this industry can be given because individual company information would be revealed. The volume of linoleum floor coverings

and table oilcloth was higher than in the previous year while that for felt based floor coverings was lower. Shipments of window and slatted blinds were valued at \$2,367,427 compared with the 1952 figure of \$2,543,055.

Of the materials used, fabrics were valued at \$4,103,844 in 1953 as against \$3,539,824 in 1952. Felt consumed in 1953 cost \$2,310,832 compared with \$2,799,657 a year earlier. There was a decrease in the value of linseed oil used from \$2,865,388 in 1952 to \$2,366,880 in 1953.

Imports of oilcloth, floor linoleum and cork matting or carpets in 1953 amounted to 36,457,900 pounds valued at \$5,567,062 compared with 28,002,820 pounds valued at \$4,305,811 in 1952. Imports of oilcloth, enamelled, carriage, shelf and table fell slightly, the figures for the two years being 1,134,588 pounds worth \$811,669 in the earlier year as against 1,114,336 pounds worth \$789,886 in the later. Exports of these commodities are not large. In the year under review, exports of oilcloth or linoleum, as used for covering floors, amounted to 9,869 square yards worth \$8,014 and oilcloth, n.o.p. to 367,538 square yards worth \$11,439.

SECTION IIA. EMBROIDERY, PLEATING, HEMSTITCHING, ETC., 1953

In 1953 this industry consisted of 155 establishments, 4 more than in the previous year. Of this total, 101 were in Quebec, 41 in Ontario, 4 in Manitoba, 3 in Saskatchewan, 3 in Alberta and 3 in British Columbia. Montreal accounted for 69 per cent of the value of factory shipments and 71 per cent of employment in the industry. Toronto was responsible for 26 per cent of shipments and 22 per cent of employment.

The industry operated at a level considerably higher than in the previous year. Factory shipments had a value, f.o.b. plant, of \$10,208,233 which amount represents an increase of 14.5 per cent over the \$8,915,278 worth of goods shipped by the industry a year earlier. Employment which stood at 1,785 in 1952 rose to 1,968 in 1953, a gain of 10 per cent, and salary and wage payments increased by 17 per

cent from \$3,403,231 to \$3,991,932 over the two years. The cost of materials consumed rose from \$3,185,502 in 1952 to \$3,419,135 in 1953, an increase of 7 per cent.

Embroidery, the industry's main product, amounted to \$4,499,073 or 44 per cent of total value of shipments. Pleating, hemstitching, button covering and buttonholes accounted for \$1,528,205 or 15 per cent. There is no detailed breakdown of the materials used in this industry.

The monthly employment of wage-earners varied from a low of 1,551 in June to a high of 1,723 in October. There is a large proportion of female wage-earners in this industry, amounting in 1953 to 64 per cent of all wage-earners.

SECTION IIB. FABRIC AUTO ACCESSORIES, 1953

The level of operations in the fabric auto accessories industry in 1953 was considerably higher than in the previous year. The number of establishments increased from 12 to 16. Employment which stood at 788 in 1952 rose to 1,083, a gain of 37 per cent, while salaries and wages paid increased by 40 per cent from \$2,044,019 in 1952 to \$2,868,803 in 1953. Factory shipments by the industry in 1953 had a value f.o.b. plant of \$11,340,386, up 45 per cent over the preceding year's figure of \$7,817,461. Since the change in finished goods inventories during both 1952 and 1953 was of insignificant proportions, value of production figures for the two years closely approximate those for shipments and the increase in 1953 was, therefore, practically the same. The cost of materials consumed in manufacture rose from \$4,508,505 in 1952 to \$6,248,415 in 1953, a gain of 39 per cent.

The 16 establishments comprising the industry in 1953 were distributed provincially as follows:

Quebec 3, Ontario 10, Manitoba 2 and British Columbia 1, Ontario dominates the industry. In the year under review this province accounted for 88 per cent of the value of its factory shipments and 87 per cent of its employment.

Products of this industry include such items as trim sets, glass run channel, seat and radiator covers, fender welts, etc. but as they are largely the production of less than three firms they cannot be fully specified. In 1953 shipments of seat covers were valued at \$1,773,152 while radiator and other covers were shipped to the extent of \$28,871.

Materials used consisted of such items as fabrics, artificial leather, metals, etc. but most of these cannot be separately classified. Upholstering materials, rubberized fabrics and other fabrics were used to the extent of \$1,870,721 in 1953 compared with \$2,114,015 in 1952.

SECTION IIC. MISCELLANEOUS TEXTILE GOODS N.E.S., 1953

For 1953 the miscellaneous textile goods n.e.s. industry reported factory shipments which had a value f.o.b. factory of \$41,694,679, up 3.6 per cent from the preceding year's figure of \$40,260,735. Employment rose from 3,487 in 1952 to 3,785 in 1953 and salary and wage payments increased from \$7,309,694 to \$8,347,168 over the two years. The material consumed in production cost \$24,970,039 in 1953 compared with \$24,027,877 in 1952.

The industry was comprised of 187 establishments, 24 more than in the previous year. Ninety-one of these were located in Quebec and 74 in Ontario. Manitoba had 12, British Columbia 7, and there were 1 each in Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and Alberta.

Factory shipments of medical and sanitary products, the chief items of production, amounted to

\$10,521,536. Included in this total are such commodities as adhesive tapes and medicated plasters, bandages, surgical gauze and dressings, sanitary napkins, etc. which cannot be shown separately without divulging particulars of individual firms. Wipers and rags, another important commodity, were shipped to the extent of 16,536,657 pounds worth \$3,972,402. Other important products are comforters, bedspreads, curtains, covers, bags, handkerchiefs, etc., details of which are to be found in Table 2.

The chief material consumed by this industry was cotton fabrics which showed an increase from 15,362,073 linear yards worth \$5,683,390 in 1952 to 15,777,481 linear yards worth \$6,272,084 in 1953. For full details of materials used reference should be made to Table 3.
