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NOTICE

THE MISCELLANEOUS TEXTILES INDUSTRIES

1957

This report consists of three sections, the first covering the carpet, mat and rug industry; the second the oilcloth, linoleum and coated fabrics industry; and the third a group of three industries which together comprise the miscellaneous textiles goods industry of the Standard Industrial Classification adopted in 1949. The three components of the miscellaneous textile goods industry are embroidery, pleating, hemstitching, etc.; fabric auto

accessories; and miscellaneous textiles n.e.s. They will be found in Sections 3A, 3B and 3C respectively. Prior to 1956 the annual survey of the carpet, mat and rug industry had been compiled and published as part of the woollen industries in the report entitled *The Wool Textile Industries*. Commencing with 1956, however, the industry has been surveyed and compiled on a separate basis, appearing in this publication.

SECTION 1. THE CARPET, MAT AND RUG INDUSTRY, 1957

Due to the impact of man-made fibres and of new production methods on the manufacture of carpets, mats and rugs, the Bureau, beginning with 1956, has surveyed this industry separately from the wool textile industry with which the carpet industry had been closely associated. Factory shipments by this industry in 1957 had a total f.o.b. factory value of \$20,978,722. This represents an increase of \$1,699,071 or 8.8 per cent over the \$19,279,651 worth of goods shipped in the previous year. Accompanying this increase in shipments was a rise in employment from 1,709 in 1956 to 1,798 in 1957 and a payroll increase from \$4,910,343 in 1956 to \$5,369,911 in the year under review. The cost of materials used amounted to \$12,293,107 in 1957 as against \$10,878,118 in 1956, an increase of 13.0 per cent.

The output of this industry is almost entirely comprised of carpets, mats and rugs. Carpets in rolls, including stair, make up the bulk of the

shipments and, of the four main types, wilton carpets accounted for 802,143 square yards worth \$6,124,397. Tufted carpets were shipped in the amount of 1,018,144 square yards valued at \$3,314,679. Shipments of squares, mats and runners totalled 325,685 square yards worth \$1,909,915. Yarns of wool, cotton, rayon, jute, etc., represent the main material used by the industry. The consumption of these in 1957 was reported as costing \$8,111,346. For further detail of shipments and of materials used, reference should be made to Tables 4 and 5 of this report.

Imports of carpets and rugs into Canada in 1957 totalled 22,471,098 square feet valued at \$11,615,251. This compares with the 1956 figure of 23,128,940 square feet worth \$11,999,948. Exports of carpets and mats were negligible. Details of imports and exports will be found in Tables 6 and 7.

SECTION 2. OILCLOTH, LINOLEUM AND COATED FABRICS, 1957

Goods having a value f.o.b. plant of \$38,903,557 were shipped from the factories of the oilcloth, linoleum and coated fabrics industry in 1957. This compared with the 1956 figure of \$35,068,889 and represents a 10.9 per cent increase. Employment, which stood at 2,864 in 1956, rose to 2,836 in 1957; while salaries and wages advanced from \$10,028,012 to \$11,512,954 over the two years. The cost of materials used increased from \$18,357,833 in 1956 to \$20,694,653 in 1957.

The industry in 1957 was comprised of 17 establishments, one more than the year before. Ten of these were located in Quebec, 5 in Ontario and 2 in British Columbia. Quebec dominated the industry by accounting for 70 per cent of total shipments and for 61 per cent of all persons employed.

The leading products of the industry were linoleum and felt based floor coverings, pyroxylin and synthetic resin coated fabrics, window blinds, table oilcloth and saturated felt. However, no detailed breakdown of the products of this industry can be given because individual company information would be revealed. The volume of both linoleum

and printed surface felt base floor coverings was lower than in the previous year. Shipments of window and slatted blinds were valued at \$2,847,441 compared with the 1956 figure of \$2,512,729.

Of the materials used, fabrics were valued at \$5,216,869 in 1957 as against \$4,321,968 in 1956. Felt consumed in 1957 cost \$2,828,397 compared with \$2,757,182 a year earlier. There was a decrease in the value of linseed oil used from \$2,402,304 in 1956 to \$2,170,194 in 1957.

Imports of oilcloth floor linoleum and cork matting or carpets in 1957 amounted to 40,731,253 pounds valued at \$5,654,247 compared with 41,875,564 pounds valued at \$5,942,323 in 1956. Imports of oilcloth, enamelled, carriage, shelf and table also decreased, the figures for the two years being 882,547 pounds worth \$705,401 in the earlier year as against 552,426 pounds worth \$414,213 in 1957. In the year under review, exports of oilcloth or linoleum, as used for covering floors amounted to 27,116 square yards worth \$16,834 and of oilcloth, n.o.p. to 652,539 square yards worth \$204,056.

SECTION 3A. EMBROIDERY, PLEATING, HEMSTITCHING, ETC., 1957

In 1957 this industry reported a total of \$8,944,746 for factory shipments of goods and receipts for work performed. This figure was somewhat below the corresponding total of \$9,314,899 in 1956. Employment was provided for 1,584 persons who received \$3,814,363 in salaries and wages which compares with 1,751 employees and an annual payroll of \$3,907,274 in the previous year. The cost of materials consumed in manufacturing dropped from \$3,299,917 in 1956 to \$2,832,196 in 1957.

In 1957 the industry consisted of 150 establishments, 11 less than in the previous year. Of this total, 95 were in Quebec, 38 in Ontario, 5 in Manitoba, 4 in Saskatchewan, 4 in Alberta and 4 in British Columbia. Montreal accounted for 73 per

cent of the value of factory shipments and for 70 per cent of employment in the industry. Toronto was responsible for 17 per cent of both shipments and employment.

Embroidery, the industry's main product, amounted to \$3,981,024 or 44 per cent of total value of shipments. Pleating, hemstitching, button covering and buttonholes accounted for \$1,229,430 or 14 per cent. There is no detailed breakdown of the materials used in this industry.

The monthly employment of wage-earners varied from a low of 1,210 in December to a high of 1,313 in May. There is a large proportion of female wage-earners in this industry, amounting in 1957 to 84 per cent of all wage-earners.

SECTION 3B. FABRIC AUTO ACCESSORIES, 1957

The fabric auto accessories industry reported a sizeable decrease in level of operations in 1957. Shipments by the establishments classified to the industry had a value of f.o.b. plant of \$11,990,137. This amount compares with the 1956 figure of \$13,700,631. Employees numbered 912 as against 991 in 1956, while their earnings dropped from \$3,220,417 to \$3,003,076. Material costs of \$7,084,909 were much lower than the \$8,675,890 spent in 1956.

The 20 establishments comprising the industry in 1956 were distributed provincially as follows: Quebec 4, Ontario 12, Manitoba 2, and British Columbia 2. Ontario continued to dominate the industry but at a reduced level. In the year under review this province accounted for 86 per cent of

the value of its factory shipments and for 84 per cent of its employment.

Products of this industry include such items as trim sets, glass run channel, seat and radiator covers, fender welts, etc., but, since they are largely the production of less than three firms, they cannot be fully specified. In 1957 shipments of seat covers were valued at \$1,840,957 while radiator and other covers were shipped to the extent of \$170,900.

Materials used consisted of such items as fabrics, artificial leather, metals, etc. but most of these cannot be separately classified. Upholstering materials, rubberized fabrics and other fabrics were used to the extent of \$3,584,362 in 1957 compared with \$3,836,231 in 1956.

SECTION 3C. MISCELLANEOUS TEXTILE GOODS N.E.S., 1957

For 1957 the miscellaneous textile goods n.e.s. industry reported factory shipments which had a value f.o.b. factory of \$51,054,625, up 2.5 per cent above the preceding year's figure of \$49,803,201. Employment declined slightly from 4,067 in 1956 to 3,977 in 1957 while salary and wage payments increased from \$10,087,070 to \$10,753,747 over the two years. The material consumed in production cost \$27,458,585 in 1957 compared with \$29,404,767 in 1956.

The industry was comprised of 180 establishments, 5 less than in the previous year. Eighty of these were located in Quebec and 78 in Ontario. Manitoba had 12, British Columbia 6, Alberta 1, Prince Edward Island 1, and Nova Scotia 2.

Factory shipments of medical and sanitary products, the chief items of production, amounted to \$13,979,609. Included in this total are such com-

modities as adhesive tapes and medicated plasters, bandages, surgical gauze and dressings, sanitary napkins, etc., which cannot be shown separately without divulging particulars of individual firms. Wipers and rags, another important commodity, were shipped to the extent of 13,850,110 pounds worth \$3,514,623. Other important products are comforters, bedspreads, curtains, covers, bags, handkerchiefs, etc., details of which are to be found in Table 30.

The chief material consumed by this industry was cotton fabrics which was used to the extent of 15,079,253 linear yards worth \$4,564,196 in 1957 compared with 24,365,803 linear yards worth \$6,281,324 in 1956. This decrease was largely offset by the increase in the cost of all other fabrics used from \$4,371,837 in 1956 to \$5,487,839 in 1957. For full details of materials used, reference should be made to Table 31.
