GENERAL REVIEW OF THE CLOTHING INDUSTRIES

1954

The level of activity in the clothing industries in 1954 fell below that of 1953, and in fact was the lowest of any postwar year. According to an index based on 1935-39=100, the volume of production for the group was 145.4, a figure considerably under the 1953 index of 167.3 and actually the lowest since 1941 when the index stood at 141.8. The gradual decline which had set in in the second quarter of 1953 continued throughout the rest of that year and well on into the year under review. An upswing occurred in the third quarter of 1954 but it was very moderate and eased in December. While some stimulus arose from the buildup of department store stocks from March on, the major factor behind the upturn seems to have been inventory reduction in the clothing industry itself. Some reduction of inventories occurred from January on, and the total inventory-shipments ratio showed great improvement vis-a-vis 1953 throughout the year.

A total of \$650,714,545 worth of goods was shipped from the factories of Canadian clothing manufacturers in 1954. This amount compares with the \$697,188,671 worth of goods shipped a year earlier and represents a decrease of 6.7 per cent. The monthly payrolls listed an average 89,693 persons in 1954 compared with 95,658 in 1953, a 6.2 per cent drop, while salary and wage payments fell by 5.2 per cent to \$191,494,875 in the later year from \$202,005,279 in the earlier. The cost of materials consumed in manufacturing amounted to \$339,959,417 in 1954 compared with \$361,558,482 in 1953, a decline of 6 per cent.

In 1954 the clothing industries were comprised of 2,733 establishments, 55 less than the year before. These were located provincially as follows: Newfoundland 3, Nova Scotia 9, New Brunswick 6, Quebec 1,629, Ontario 816, Manitoba 157, Saskatchewan 14, Alberta 27 and British Columbia 72. Quebec was the foremost province with shipments amounting to \$413,403,984 or 64 per cent of total and employees numbering 56,282 or 63 per cent of all persons employed. Ontario, in second place, was responsible for shipments valued at \$174,510,534 and 24,726 employees, 27 and 28 per cent, respectively, of total.

Principal statistics by economic area, by industry, are given in Table 5. In 1954, men's factory clothing was the leading clothing industry in the Atlantic Provinces with factory shipments valued at \$2,057,944. Hats and caps with shipments worth \$801,772 ranked second in this area.

The women's factory clothing industry proved to be the main clothing industry in Quebec in the year under review. Shipments by this industry were valued at \$151,632,203, followed by men's factory clothing, \$135,991,124, children's factory clothing, \$34,647,860, and fur goods, \$32,971,876. In Ontario, the men's factory clothing industry with shipments worth \$72,552,335 was the most important. Women's factory clothing was in second place with shipments valued at \$48,573,849, followed by fur goods, \$18,778,511, and hats and caps, \$11,578,002.

The men's factory clothing and the women's factory clothing were also first and second in the Prairie Provinces, shipments by the two industries amounting to \$25,747,279 and \$13,436,111, respectively. The position of these two industries was reversed in British Columbia where shipments by women's factory clothing totalled \$4,871,718 and by men's factory clothing, \$4,041,603. Fur goods was in third place in the two areas with shipments in the Prairie Provinces amounting to \$6,035,968 and in British Columbia to \$520,896.

Beginning with 1954, information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses is being collected as part of the annual Census of Industry. This data was formerly collected by a separate survey. The summarized results for the clothing industries for the year under review will be found in Table 3.

A principal feature of this report is a detailed list of the clothing products shipped by Canadian manufacturers in 1953 and 1954. Table 15 records total factory shipments and hence includes commodities reported by all firms no matter what their industrial classification.
