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# GENERAL REVIEW OF THE CLOTHING INDUSTRIES 1956

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# GENERAL REVIEW OF THE CLOTHING INDUSTRIES

## 1956

The value of products shipped from the factories of Canadian clothing manufacturers in 1956 was \$733,769,962. This amount was a record one, surpassing the previous record total of \$697,188,671 shipped in 1953. It represents an increase of \$49,408,060 or 7.2 per cent over the \$684,361,902 worth of goods shipped in 1955.

Every industry in the clothing group except fur dressing and dyeing, contributed to the increase in the value of factory shipments in 1956. A large part of the \$49,408,060 gain was accounted for by the men's factory clothing industry (\$21,683,600) the women's factory clothing industry (\$11,264,360), the children's factory clothing industry (\$7,795,933) and the corset industry (\$2,496,865). Percentage-wise, the increases made by these industries were 8.7, 5.0, 15.6, and 9.9 per cent, respectively, the gain in the children's factory clothing industry being the largest in the group.

The commodity breakdown of factory shipments shown in Table 15 includes shipments of clothing from all industries, although most of them come from the clothing industry. In such shipments, increases were quite general among the more important items of men's and youths' wear. The outstanding advance was reported for suits, shipments of which rose from 1,709,928 in 1955 to 1,890,908 in 1956. Fine pants and slacks increased in number from 3,262,242 to 3,283,033 and fine shirts from 709,129 dozen to 720,098 dozen; in the latter case, this was entirely due to an increase in the number of silk and rayon and of dress shirts shipped, since the number of cotton and of nylon ones decreased. In women's wear, coats, dresses and suits were somewhat lower than the previous year, the shipments, with 1955 figures in brackets, being as follows: cloth coats 1,531,496 (1,586,293), fur coats 219,596 (211,073), dresses 11,565,725 (12,687,705) and suits 710,176 (713,033). Blouses and skirts, on the other hand, were higher with shipments totalling 754,162 dozen (726,623 dozen) and 5,440,753 (5,027,929), respectively. Nylon full fashioned hosiery was up to 4,070,335 dozen pairs in 1956 from 4,026,999 dozen pairs in 1955 and women's nylon seamless hosiery rose from 597,874 dozen pairs to 978,342 dozen pairs over the two years.

Changes in all types of children's wear were relatively minor. Sweaters, cardigan and pullovers continued, as in 1955, to gain with shipments rising from 1,061,642 dozen in the former year to 1,191,450 dozen in the year under review. Sizable increases were also reported for foundation garments and underwear.

In 1956, for the first time, it was possible to separate out certain important commodities either because of increased shipments or of a change in classification. The most important of these is probably overcoats and topcoats for men, youths' and boys, which were broken down between the two kinds of coats. Attention is also drawn to following three new breakdowns:

- (a) raincoats;
- (b) nylon seamless hosiery by type; and
- (c) men's and youths' and boys' sports shirts by material.

The inventories of finished goods held by the clothing industries in plant and plant warehouses

advanced from \$37,439,300 at the beginning of the year to \$41,491,026 at the end. Adjusting shipments by this \$4,051,726 increases results in an estimated gross value of production of \$737,821,688 an advance of 7.5 per cent over the preceding year's \$686,528,979. Employment in 1956 was slightly higher than in 1955 being 89,799 and 89,686, respectively, whereas salary and wage payments were higher by 6.0 per cent in the year under review, \$208,216,211 versus \$196,436,749. A 10.9 per cent increase in material costs to \$399,249,027 from \$359,882,938 accompanied the rise in the gross value of production.

In 1956 the clothing industries were comprised of 2,525 establishments, 123 less than the year before. These were located provincially as follows: Newfoundland 3, Nova Scotia 9, New Brunswick 4, Quebec 1,559, Ontario 700, Manitoba 154, Saskatchewan 12, Alberta 24, and British Columbia 60. Quebec was the foremost province with shipments amounting to \$469,088,037 or 64 per cent of total and employees numbering 56,497 or 63 per cent of all persons employed. Ontario, in second place, was responsible for shipments valued at \$193,720,881 and for 24,208 employees, respectively 26 and 27 per cent of the industry total.

Principal statistics by economic area, by industry, are given in Table 5. In 1956, men's factory clothing was the leading clothing industry in the Atlantic Provinces with factory shipments valued at \$2,204,402. Hats and caps with shipments worth \$881,710 ranked second in this area.

The women's factory clothing industry proved to be the main clothing industry in Quebec in the year under review. Shipments by this industry were valued at \$166,180,661, followed by men's factory clothing, \$152,919,664, children's factory clothing \$44,325,768, and fur goods, \$36,414,152. In Ontario, the men's factory clothing industry with shipments worth \$80,155,925 was the most important. Women's factory clothing was in second place with shipments valued at \$52,577,025, followed by fur goods, \$18,710,305 and hats and caps, \$11,807,415.

The men's factory clothing and the women's factory clothing were also first and second in the Prairie Provinces, shipments by the two industries amounting to \$31,851,689 and \$13,532,353, respectively. The position of these two industries was reversed in British Columbia where shipments by women's factory clothing totalled \$5,261,425 and by men's factory clothing, \$5,014,235. Fur goods was in third place in the two areas with shipments in the Prairie Provinces amounting to \$5,264,107 and in British Columbia to \$602,605.

Beginning with 1954, information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses has been collected as part of the annual Census of Industry. This data was formerly collected by a separate survey. The summarized results for the clothing industries for the year under review will be found in Table 3.

A principal feature of this report is a detailed list of the clothing products shipped by Canadian manufacturers in 1955 and 1956. Table 15 records total factory shipments and hence includes commodities reported by all firms no matter what their industrial classification.
