THE CORSET INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1947

In 1947 reports were received from forty establishments engaged in the production of corsets and kindred articles, 18 of which were located in Quebec and 22 in Ontario. Quebec, however, occupied the leading position in the industry with over 63 per cent of the gross value of production and over 62 per cent of the number of persons given employment.

Goods with a selling value at the factory of \$14,121,811 were produced in 1947, this amount representing an increase of \$2,006,225 or 16.6 per cent over the previous year. Employment was given to 3.259 persons, 432 or 15.3 per cent more than in 1946, and the payroll at \$4,093,288 was greater by \$804,221 or 24.5 per cent. Materials used cost \$6,276,125, an increase of \$1,164,433 or 22.8 per cent.

The 188,774 dozen corsets and girdles produced were valued at \$5.765.336 and this amount represented 40.8 per cent of the total value of production in the corset industry. The average price per dozen at \$30.54 was \$5.22 higher than the average of the previous year. The output of combination garments amounted to 44.683 dozens valued at \$1,698,719 while bandeaux and brassieres accounted for \$5,292,044.

As may be observed in Table 5, of the 40 establishments reporting the 10 largest were responsible for a production of \$9,910,415 or over 70 per cent of the total and furnished employment to 2,160 persons or over 66 per cent of all persons employed.

The month of highest employment of wage-earners was March, when 2,733 persons were reported and December with 2,533 was the month of minimum employment. Females represent 89.5 per cent of the wage-earners in the industry.
