THE FUR GOODS INDUSTRY, CANADA, 1926

INTRODUCTION

Establishments.— The number of establishments engaged in the manufacture of fur goods in Canada in 1926 was 221, compared with 218 in 1925. The number of establishments by provinces in each of the two years is given in the following statement, the numbers for 1925 being shown within brackets: Nova Scotia, 1 (1); New Brunswick, 3 (3); Quebec, 77 (76); Ontario, 110 (107); Manitoba, 16 (15); Saskatchewan 1 (1); Alberta, 9 (10); British Columbia, 4 (5).

Production.— The output of the establishments was considerably greater than in the preceding year, the total value of production in 1926 amounting to \$16,941,249, an increase over the year 1925 of \$4,798,386 or 34 per cent. The increase is attributable chiefly to the greater production of fur coats for women, which in 1926 totalled 70,450, valued at \$12,137,596 an increase over the preceding year of 21,378 in number and of \$3,702,413 in value. The value of women's fur coats in 1926 represented 64 per cent of the total value of output of the fur goods establishments in that year, while the value of men's fur coats represented only 3 per cent. Increases over the preceding year are shown also in the production of fur coats for children. The item of fur cuffs shows a decrease in quantity and in value, and the item of fur collars shows a decrease in quantity, but an increase in value. The average value of putput per establishment in 1926 was \$75,707, compared with \$64,875 in 1925 and \$56,263 in 1924. Comparative statistics of production for 1925 and 1926 are given in the following table.



THE FUR GOODS INDUSTRY, CANADA

Capital.— The total capital investment of the industry was valued at \$11,733,311, apportioned as follows: land, buildings and machinery, \$2,016,924; materials and products on hand, stocks in process, etc., \$5,855,103; and cash and operating accounts, \$3,771,284. The total capital shows an increase of \$1,276,522 over the preceding year. The average capital investment per establishment in 1926 was \$53,092, compared with \$47,967 in 1925 and \$45,463 in 1924.

Employees and Salaries and Wages.— The industry gave employment in 1926 to 2,907 persons, compared with 2,443 in 1925. The total for 1926 comprises 518 office employees and 2,389 factory workers. In this industry the women employees outnumber the men, the total number of women employed in 1926 being 1,491, and the number of men, 1,416. The amount paid in salaries during the year was \$867,605, and in wages, \$2,636,691, a total of \$3,504,296, compared with a total of \$2,804,341 in 1925. The month of highest employment for factory workers in 1926 was November, when 2,820 persons were employed, and the month of lowest employment, February, with 1,956 employees.

Time in Operation and Hours of Work.— The total number of days operated by all establishments during the year was 64,060, an average per establishment of 289.8 days, compared with a total of 61,823 and an average of 283.5 in 1925. The average number of hours worked per day was 8.3 in both years. The classification of wage-earners according to number of hours worked per day in month of highest employment shows 2,072 working 8 hours per day or less; 797 working 9 hours; 47 working 10 hours; and 27 working over 10 hours.

Power Equipment.— The power equipment of the establishments consists entirely of electric motors, the number of which in 1926 was 349, with a total rated capacity of 389 h.p.

Materials Used.— The value of all materials used in manufacture during the year was \$12,202,092, divided as follows: raw furs, \$2,913,278; dressed furs, \$7,343,666; and other materials, \$1,945,148. The total value of all materials shows an increase over the preceding year of \$3,577,050, or 41 per cent.


IMPORTS AND EXPORTS.

Imports.— The imports of unmanufactured furs, comprising furs and skins, dressed and undressed, during the calendar year 1926 had a total value of \$12,438,012, compared with \$9,643,438 in 1925. Manufactures of furs imported had a total value of \$122,123, compared with \$123,865 in the preceding year. The value of all furs imported in 1926 amounted to \$12,560,135, an increase of \$2,792,832 over the year 1925. The value of furs from the United States represented 69 per cent of the total imports, in 1926.

Exports.— The value of Canada's exports of furs during the year 1926 amounted to \$19,489,589, an increase over the preceding year of \$2,058,261, or 12 per cent. The exports to the United Kingdom and to the United States represent respectively 37 and 61 per cent of the total exports in both years. Tables 12 and 13.




THE FUR DRESSING INDUSTRY, CANADA.

The number of fur skins treated in fur dressing and dyeing establishments in Canada during the year 1926 was 5,444,739, compared with 4,190,351 in 1925 and 3,473,909 in 1924. The principal item in each year is muskrat, with 1,968,161 skins in 1926; 1,882,031 skins in 1925; and 1,615,520 skins in 1924. Rabbit is next in importance in 1926 with regard to number of skins treated, with 1,189,353 skins, 927 of which were classified as Chinchilla rabbit. Squirrel is third on the list, followed by skunk, lamb, opossum, mole, goat, fox, raccoon, wolf, mink, mandel and hair seal in the order named. The following table shows the numbers of the different kinds of skins treated during the years 1925 and 1926.




THE FUR DRESSING INDUSTRY, CANADA.

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

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
