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THE FUR GOODS INDUSTRY, CANADA, 1932.

Production.— Furs are regarded somewhat as luxuries — although in the more northerly regions they are almost necessities — and consequently the fur goods industry is one which suffered severely from the effects of the general depression. In 1929 the value of output of this industry was \$18,944,726, decreasing to \$15,733,768 in 1930 and to \$14,246,993 in 1931, while in 1932, the year covered by the present report, production had a value of only \$10,791,838, a decrease of 24 per cent from the value of 1931, and a decrease of 43 per cent from that of 1929. The quantity of product likewise decreased. The number of fur coats and jackets for women shows a total in 1932 of 55,306, compared with 66,015 in 1931, while the average price per garment was \$104, compared with \$124 in the earlier year. The number of men's fur coats decreased from 3,174 in 1931 to 1,132 in 1932; fur collars from 227,158 to 115,479 and stoles and scarves, from 32,103 to 22,652. One item for which an increase is recorded is "muffs", the quantity manufactured in 1932 amounting to 6,036, compared with 2,510 in 1931. The total amount received for custom work, repairs and storage in 1932 was \$2,295,596, a decrease in value of only \$150,144 from 1931, and an increase of \$15,754 over 1930, which shows that the volume of such work must have been considerably greater in 1932 as average charges, in that year were lower than for many years.

THE FUR GOODS INDUSTRY, CANADA

Number of Establishments and Value of Capital.—The number of establishments engaged in the manufacture of fur goods in Canada in 1932 was 269, distributed by provinces as follows: Ontario, 133; Quebec, 102; Manitoba, 20; Alberta, 7; British Columbia, 4; and Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Saskatchewan, one each. The total number shows an increase of one over the number recorded in the preceding year. The value of the capital investment of the industry amounted to \$9,790,267, a decrease from 1931 of \$2,341,208, or 19 per cent. The average value per establishment in 1932 was \$36,395, compared with \$45,267 in 1931.

Employees and Salaries and Wages.—The number of persons employed by these plants totalled 2,516, of which 571 were salaried employees (managers, superintendents, professional and clerical) and 1,945, factory workers. The total number shows a decrease of 363 from 1931. Salaries and wages paid during the year amounted to \$2,771,204, the salaried employees receiving \$926,914, or 33 per cent of the total, and the wage-earners, \$1,844,290, or 67 per cent. Compared with the preceding year, the total salary and wage bill shows a decrease of \$722,993, or 21 per cent. Naturally, in this industry, the fall and early winter months are those of highest employment. The number of wage-earners in the monthly record of employment for the first four months of 1932 ranged from 1,614 in January to 1,627 in April. Increases are noted in each of the months following, the peak being reached in November, with a total of 2,447. December employment receded slightly, with a total of 2,240 wage-earners recorded.

Materials Used.—The furs used in the manufacture of the various fur goods had a total cost value of \$5,619,308, and other materials used (linings, trimmings, etc.), \$769,066, making a total for all materials used of \$6,388,374, a decrease from 1931 of \$2,216,785, or 26 per cent.

FOREIGN TRADE

Exports.—Canada exports annually large numbers of raw furs, but her export trade in dressed furs and manufactured fur goods is of little importance. The total value of all exports of Canadian furs during the calendar year 1932 was \$10,955,443, of which the amount of \$10,870,456, or 99 per cent, is credited to raw furs. The value of dressed furs exported was \$45,732 and of manufactures of furs, \$39,255. The value of furs exported to the United Kingdom represented 60 per cent of the total fur exports for the year, to the United States, 25 per cent, and to France, 9 per cent, while the remaining 6 per cent was divided among various other countries.

Imports.—Canada's imports of furs in 1932 had a total value of \$3,829,559, of which 71 per cent is credited to furs from the United States.

THE FUR DRESSING INDUSTRY, CANADA

The dressing and dyeing of furs comprise a Canadian industry which needs to expand considerably in order that it may take care of a larger proportion of the annual fur production of Canada, as well as of furs of foreign origin. In 1932 there were 13 plants engaged in the dressing and dyeing of fur skins, of which 7 were in Quebec, 4 in Ontario, and 2 in Manitoba. The principal kinds of skins treated, with regard to number, were rabbit (2,736,881), muskrat (2,519,656), and squirrel (953,685). The rabbit and squirrel skins are mostly imported while the muskrat would be chiefly of Canadian origin. Silver fox skins treated totalled 27,312, other kinds of fox, 40,828, and ermine (weasel), another well-known Canadian fur bearer, 30,250.

The total amount received by the plants in 1932 for the treatment of the furs was \$1,384,511, compared with \$1,571,740 in 1931, and \$1,625,824 in 1930.
